On March 6, 1940, Doctor ERBEN returned to the New York Division, stating that following his interview of the preceding evening he had consulted an attorney and as a result desired to make several points clearer. u

The first of these was that German passports are not given under oath, that no oath of allegiance is necessary in order to obtain them, and that at the time he received a German passport at Buenos Aires he took no oath of allegiance to the German government, and the sole reason for his accepting a German passport was that his failure to do so would have resulted in reprisals against his family by the German authorities since it would have clearly indicated that he was not sincere in his desire to return to Germany. u

The second item which he desired to stress was that the only thing he could produce which would be in his favor would be character evidence, and accordingly he desired to refer to the following persons: u

Mr. ENGLIS II, United States Vice Consul at Buenos Aires,
Mr. R. E. WILSON, U. S. Vice Consul at Buenos Aires,
Mr. McNIECE, U. S. Vice Consul at Buenos Aires,
Mr. ADAMS, U. S. Vice Consul at Antofagasta.

The next point which he desired to stress was that the Bureau of Narcotics had conducted an investigation of his activities from 1932 to 1936, at the conclusion of which they had furnished him with a letter stating that he was completely absolved of any suspicion as a narcotic smuggler. He stated that Mr. ANSLINGER in Washington, D. C., knew of his case very well and had a very large file concerning it. u

The next matter which he desired to emphasize was the fact that in order to best show his non-Nazi sympathies he would refer to a Jewish doctor, Doctor GERTRUDE MARY, 11 Elliott Avenue, Bryn Mawr, Pennsylvania, who was brought out of Germany by him in 1938 through the ruse of signing her on as a member of the crew of the boat on which he was then sailing. He also stated that he desired to refer to the daughter of CHARLES EVANS HUGHES, who had been his patient at Morristown, New Jersey. As further evidence of the truth of his statements he exhibited to the writer a telegram dated March 6, 1940, which was signed "ERROL", inviting Doctor ERBEN to come immediately to Hollywood and stay with him. Doctor ERBEN stated that this was from ERROL FLYNN. u

Doctor ERBEN also stated that concerning his job on the United Fruit Company boat it now appeared that something had occurred that the fruit company had undoubtedly realized that Doctor ERBEN was being investigated inasmuch as they were now cool toward employing him. He stated that he doubted very much that he would be signed on. 4

The fact that Doctor ERBEN has tried repeatedly to obtain a commission in the naval reserve was confirmed, the record's indicating that he had tried on various occasions since 1931 and in fact had reapplied on February 5 but due to bad eyesight and overweight would not be accepted.

By reference telegram the Washington Field Division advised that Subject ERBEN was located at 64 Hudson Street, Hoboken, awaiting a reply from the Bureau of Marine Inspection and Navigation of the Department of Commerce concerning duplicates of his seaman's papers to enable him to sign as a ship's surgeon on the S. S. Castilla of the United Fruit Company sailing from New York March 11. u

dated at New York, New York, March 18, 1940. [REDACTED]

At the time of his interview on March 5, 1940, Doctor ERBEN stated that at Rahia Blanca, Argentina, Buenos Aires, Valparaiso, Chile, and Antofagasta, Chile, he reported diligently, at each of these cities, to the Gestapo representative stationed there. He stated that usually this representative was to be found at the German consulate, although in some places the Gestapo agent has his office in the Hamburg-American or North German Lloyd lines.

With reference to New York City, Doctor ERBEN stated that he has reported to the Gestapo since his arrival on February 20, 1940, and that such reporting was done by him at the Gestapo headquarters located in Room 7 of the German consulate suite at 17 Battery Place. He stated that the Gestapo agents to whom he reported were Consul DRAEGER, Mr. MAISCH, and Miss KOCH. Doctor ERBEN was very reluctant to discuss this phase of his case, indicating that if the Gestapo ever learned that he had made any statement concerning it his sons in Germany would immediately be killed as an example to him to remain silent. He did further state, however, that the various German papers which were delivered to him at Buenos Aires by the German consulate were turned over to the Gestapo agent at Antofagasta to be transmitted by registered mail to Doctor ERBEN's friend, Doctor RUDOLPH SCHAFER, 850 Park Avenue, New York. These documents have never been received by Doctor SCHAFER and accordingly Doctor ERBEN is very much perturbed, being uncertain as to whether the failure to arrive is due to the activities of the Gestapo or whether it is due to tampering with the U. S. Mail on the part of some other agency.

Dear Sir:

This will acknowledge receipt of your letter of March 20, 1940, in which you advise that the United States Attorney has requested information which will assist him in prosecuting the cancellation of the citizenship of Dr. Irben.

The Bureau has no objection to your furnishing information from your files which may be of assistance to the United States Attorney. However, I wish to call to your attention that dispatches received from the State Department were furnished to the Bureau under confidential cover and this information should be treated as such. You might point out to the United States Attorney, however, that the State Department has a file on this individual and may be able to furnish him assistance in this regard.

I have directed a letter to the State Department advising of the contemplated action on the part of the United States Attorney and requesting whether the Department had any objection to furnishing the United States Attorney with the contents of the various dispatches received from the Foreign representatives of the State Department regarding this individual.

I wish to specifically call to your attention the report of Special Agent [redacted] New York City, dated March 18, 1940, setting forth the results of an interview with Dr. Irben. It would appear that the verbal admissions of Dr. Irben as set forth in this report will be of material assistance to the United States Attorney in connection with the proceedings contemplated.

be obtained from the files of the Narcotic Bureau in the custody of WILLIAM GARLAND, District Supervisor, 810 Federal Office Building, New York City.

In connection with this subject, it is noted that on March 20, 1940, DR. ERBEN appeared at the Washington Field Office, wanting to know whether any further information were desired concerning him in addition to the information he had already furnished to the New York Office, in which event he would be glad to enlighten the Bureau as to any question about himself that has not as yet been made clear by the information he had already given to Agent [redacted] of the New York Office.

b7c DR. ERBEN stated that he came to Washington to see whether he could obtain the original or a duplicate of his Seaman's Protection Certificate, which had been taken away from him at the time he applied for a passport in San Francisco, California, and that with this in view, he called at the Bureau of Marine Inspection and Navigation, and also at the Passport Division, State Department.

DR. ERBEN also stated that he is rather worried on account of apparent efforts by the Immigration and Naturalization Service in San Francisco, and also by other law enforcement authorities, to deprive him of his American citizenship, and that he has not as yet made up his mind as to whether he will appear at the trial in San Francisco on May 7, 1940 in person, or whether he will leave the matter in the hands of his counsel, CHAUNCEY TRAMUTOLO of San Francisco.

DR. ERBEN stated that he is a loyal American citizen, and has nothing to hide as far as his activities are concerned; that he is not now, and has never been before engaged in any espionage activities, and that his apparent German leanings were but a camouflage, with the aim in mind to maintain his good standing in the eyes of the German government in the interests of the safety and welfare of his mother who lives in Vienna, and of his two sons who are in Germany.

The Identification Division of the Bureau has recently located a record of a Dr. Hermann Frederick Arden, alias Von Arden which indicated that this individual was carried on the confidential list furnished by the Narcotic Bureau dated July 1, 1939. The information contained on the notice furnished by the Narcotic Bureau indicates Dr. Arden for three years was ship's doctor with the Dollar Line Steamship Company, and was discharged from the S. S. Garfield because of suspicion that he was engaged in trafficking narcotics. He was subsequently reported practicing medicine in Shanghai and alleged to have associated with a group of doctors who were handling narcotics. He was also said to have connections at Manila and Singapore and to maintain a residence at 111 Arnsbergstrasse 19, Vienna. His description is set forth as follows:

This individual is undoubtedly identical with the subject of this case, and I am furnishing the above information to you as a matter of possible interest. A letter is being directed to the Narcotic Bureau advising it of the recent visit of this individual to the New York Office.

In view of Dr. Erben's alleged activities in connection with narcotics, I wish to call your attention to the letter of March 20, 1940, addressed to the Bureau by the New York Office, wherein it is noted Dr. Erben stated certain papers delivered to him at Buenos Aires by the German Consulate were turned over to the Gestapo agent at Antofagasta, Chile, to be transmitted by registered mail to Dr. Erben's friend, Dr. Rudolph Scharf, 550 Park Avenue, New York, New York. These documents were not received by Dr. Scharf, according to Dr. Erben, which had caused his some undue anxiety. It may possibly be that the mailing of these so-called communications might involve Dr. Erben's narcotic activities.

For the benefit of the San Francisco Office, the office of origin in this case, I am transmitting herewith a copy of the New York letter of March 20, 1940.

I am transmitting herewith photographs and photographic copies of the signature of Dr. Erben, which appear on the notice placed by the Narcotic Bureau in the Identification Division.

It is suggested that the New York Office advise the Bureau and the San Francisco Office whether this photograph is identical with that of subject Erben, who recently visited the New York Office and was interviewed.

luggage were five small paper packages described as bindles of morphine. In the luggage also was a scrapbook containing newspaper clippings and photographs of ERBEN'S various travels around the world. Most of the data contained therein already appears in the San Francisco file of this case; however, various clippings showed the following criminal record for ERBEN:

In September 1935 he was arrested by the Calcutta, India, Police under Section 19F of the Indian Arms Act on the charge of possession of revolver and cartridges without license. He was sentenced to pay a fine of 300 rupees or three months in jail. He paid the fine and was ordered deported from India.

A clipping from a Barcelona, Spain, newspaper, date not shown, but it would appear to have been published during the period that ERBEN was in Spain with ERROL FLYNN, the motion picture actor, inasmuch as one photograph shows FLYNN and ERBEN at dinner with the Commissar of Propaganda in Barcelona, states that ERBEN is a "militant Communist".

b7c [REDACTED] The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent

CHAUNCEY TRAMUTOLO, attorney at law, 607 Alexander Bldg., stated that he had been representing ERBEN in connection with his hearing for the purpose of revocation of his naturalization. The hearing has been continued to May 6, 1940, in the U. S. District Court at San Francisco before Federal Judge MARTIN I. WELSH. TRAMUTOLO stated that the last letter he received from the subject gave his address as c/o DR. RUDOLPH SCHAFER, 850 Park Ave., New York City. According to TRAMUTOLO, ERBEN'S permanent address is DR. HERMANN ERBEN (Marinearzt) Wien 111 Arenbergring 19, Germany, telephone B55-8-24. u

A confidential informant of the San Francisco office stated that although he had no proof, he believed ERBEN to be a Nazi spy and knew that ERBEN was making it a point to contact prominent doctors of German extraction throughout the United States. u

The State Department has furnished the following information concerning DR. ERBEN:

ERBEN was in the Port of Antofogasta, Chile, enroute from Valparaiso to Callao on the Japanese motor ship HEYO MARU and because of a vacancy in the crew of the S. S. NIGHTINGALE, an American vessel, signed on as a messman. It was determined that ERBEN claimed to have

been in Vienna just before the Munich crisis, where he was visiting his mother. He had received instructions to report to Army headquarters. He had placed himself under the orders of the German admiralty and shipped as a surgeon on the USUKAMA, which arrived in Buenos Aires after the outbreak of the war. He received orders to report to the German ship TACOMA to be returned to Germany for further service but never did this because the TACOMA became involved in the GRAF SPEE affair. He then requested German officials at Buenos Aires for permission to return to Germany by his own means. His petition was granted. When he reached Valparaiso, Chile, ERBEN alleges he received orders to report to a German vessel in Talcahuano and put to sea when it did. He claimed that he had disregarded these orders and embarked as a passenger on the Japanese HEYO MARU in an attempt to return to the United States. While on the NIGHTINGALE, ERBEN at Valparaiso was met by a large delegation from the members of the crew of the German sailing ship PRIEWALD and the impression was gained by Captain PARKER of the NIGHTINGALE that ERBEN was a man of considerable importance to them, judged by the deference shown him and the number of Nazi salutes given him. While in Valparaiso, ERBEN spent all of his spare time aboard the PRIEWALD and also obtained a boat and went around the Chilean battleship LA TORRE, photographing it from stem to stern. When the NIGHTINGALE called at Coquimbo, ERBEN was again met by a large delegation of Germans and otherwise employed himself photographing everything in sight. Inasmuch as the NIGHTINGALE was taking on 4800 tons of copper at Antofogasta on the return trip north-bound, which copper would probably eventually find its way to the Anglo-French Allies in the European war, the Captain of the NIGHTINGALE gave orders to the ship's officers to keep a sharp watch over ERBEN and not permit him access to certain parts of the ship. Orders were given to keep ERBEN out of the engine room because of the NIGHTINGALE'S being one of the new Maritime Commission freighters, said to have new developments in the engine room. The Chief Engineer subsequently reported that ERBEN attempted to get into the engine room with his camera.

According to the Americal Consul at Antofogasta, Chile, ERBEN intended to sign off the NIGHTINGALE when it reached the Panama Canal claiming that he could there catch a vessel bound for California, where the climate would be milder and where he had friends who would help him. When asked who his friends were, he mentioned the name of ERROL FLYNN, the actor, and ERNEST HEMINGWAY, the author, with whom he had gone to Spain to fight in the Spanish Civil War.

Confidential Informant [redacted] received word from the 11th Naval District that the subject had gone through the Panama Canal on the S. S. NIGHTINGALE as a messman, photographing everything in sight.

According to the report received from the Department of State from the American Consul at Antofogasta, Chile, ERBEN'S mother, JOHANA ERBEN, resides at Vienna 3 Arenbergring 19. ERBEN is reported to have two sons in the German Army, now on active duty, who served in the Polish campaign. ERBEN admitted to the Consulate participation in the Spanish Civil War and in the present conflict in China.

In addition to the foregoing Dr. Erben subsequently advised the New York Office that he had reported to the Gestapo since his arrival in New York City on February 20, 1940. He alleges that the Gestapo headquarters are located in Room 7 of the German Consulate Suite at 17 Battery Place. He stated that the Gestapo Agents to whom he reported were Consul Dragger, Mr. Vogel, Mr. Kaisch and Miss Koch. Dr. Erben was very reluctant to discuss this phase of the matter, indicating that if the Gestapo learned that he had made any statement concerning it his sons in Germany would immediately be liquidated. U

He further stated, however, that the German papers which were delivered to him at Buenos Aires by the German Consul there were turned over to the Gestapo Agent at Antofagasta, Chile, to be transmitted by registered mail to Dr. Erben's friend, Dr. Rudolph Scharf, 850 Park Avenue, New York. These documents allegedly have never been received by Dr. Scharf and accordingly Dr. Erben is very much perturbed. U



Dear Mr. Anslinger:

As you will recall sometime ago you furnished this Bureau with a photograph and description of Dr. Hermann Frederick Erben (Von Erben) with your confidential list #249 of narcotic violators issued by the United States Bureau of Narcotics.

For your information, I wish to advise that a Dr. Hermann Frederick Erben, who is apparently identical with the individual whose name you previously furnished the Bureau, appeared at the New York Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation and was interviewed relative to his background and recent activities.

For your further information, this Bureau has been conducting an investigation of Dr. Erben to determine if he is possibly engaged in espionage activities. It is my understanding that the United States Attorney at San Francisco, California is proceeding legally to revoke the citizenship of Dr. Erben, whose activities might indicate he is not desirable.
