ERBEN TESTIMIES TO UNHAPPINESS

Dramatic Statements End Trial of Doctor Over Citizenship

Dr. Herman Frederic Erben's dramatic testimony that his American citizenship had brought him "nothing but unhappiness" yesterday concluded the trial of the Alsop-born brain surgeon, whom the Government has charged with espionage. Federal Judge Max Baughman set November 12 as the final date for filing of briefs by both sides and will hand down his verdict some time after that date.

FRANK BRIDEN, Erben's attorney, said yesterday that Erben was "genuinely and sincerely" called into question by the Government. He declared that the real question was whether the American citizenship had cost Erben his life. He said that one of his sons had been killed in the invasion of Poland, he didn't know where the other was, both had been taken to the front. UNDER QUIZ AS SPY DR. ERBEN ADMITS

S. A. Specialist Reveals Motive For Move to Cancel Citizenship

Motive behind the Government's move to cancel the citizenship of Dr. Herman Frederick Erben, San Francisco brain specialist and authority on tropical diseases, was revealed yesterday. The 43-year-old Vienna-born doctor himself admitted he is under investigation by the military intelligence service, a report that he is in some way involved in Nazi espionage work.

Dr. Erben said that Federal agents have been investigating his activities, particularly since he came back to the United States to receive his ship's surgeon's license, which acted as a reply to the German government's demand that he be allowed to practice medicine in his native Austria.

Dr. Erben, who was born in Vienna, Austria, in 1906, came to the United States in 1931 and practiced medicine in San Francisco. He received his medical degree from the University of Vienna in 1931 and his ship's surgeon's license in 1941.

Dr. Erben is now in the custody of the military intelligence service.
