Irving Ferman confidentially furnished me the attached copy of a letter from Louis Joughin, Assistant Director of the American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU) to Professor Ralph S. Brown, Jr., inviting Brown to prepare a pamphlet to be issued by the Due Process Committee of the ACLU. According to Ferman, a Philadelphia group headed by an attorney named Rahill, who is active in representing Socialist Worker Party cases, is very persistent in pushing such a pamphlet.
