As we discussed last week, I attended the Libyan goodwill tour briefing at the Omni on Tuesday, January 9th. A copy of the agenda is attached.

The Libyan delegation consisted of about 20 people from all sectors of the Libyan economy. I am getting a copy of the list of attendees later. My impression was this was more a cultural and goodwill exchange rather than a trading trip per se.

I visited with some of their people individually and left a set of our sales information packet with them. I don't know what will come from it in a commercial sense since the emphasis was on cultural and goodwill aspects of life rather than trading.

SUBJECT: Exclusive Agency Agreement/ Worldwide Trading Corporation

[REDACTED] has passed along the above referenced agreement for my review and comment. As a result of my review, I would like to point out the following problem areas in the agreement: b7C

1. Assuming minimum offers are made to Gold Kist this agency relationship is for a term of eleven years.
2. As a result of the exclusivity of the agency relationship, commissions would be due and payable on all sales by Gold Kist to Libya. It is unclear from the agreement whether this includes merely sales to the government or to other enterprises in Libya.
3. The basis for commission's computation is the total sales prices as evidenced by the amounts referred to in letters of credit for these sales.
4. Section 2.A. seems to imply that the agent will be representing Libya as well as Gold Kist. This is not legally permissible.
5. Section 3.A. should be a covenant by the agent instead of by the principal. Section 3.B. requests certain technical information and data. What if requested information is unavailable?
6. Section 4 describing the term as one year is in conflict with the renewal provisions.
7. I am not sure what the phrase "in gross" means as it appears in Section 5.
8. There is no limiting language in Section 5 regarding the authenticity or reasonableness of any orders which are to be submitted by Libya. It appears that the agent could continue the agreement by having the Libyan government submit ridiculous or outrageous orders.
9. The last sentence of Section 7 is out of place.
10. We need to know more about the two corporations referred to in this agreement, namely RLS Enterprises and Worldwide Trading Corporation.

I find it somewhat strange that Jewish concerns will be dealing directly with the Libyan government. An inquiry into this relationship may produce additional useful information. As you can gather from my comments above, I strongly suggest that major modifications be made to the agreement before we should ever consider entering into such an arrangement. 1. Commission to vary between 1-1/2 and 2-1/2 percent (certainly usual for that part of the world).
2. Term of one year but automatically renewed for the next 10 years if Gold Kist is given a "look" at a minimum of \$100 million of business each year.

Robert L. Schwind, Attorney At Law with the firm of Levine and Meltz, 41 Marietta Street, N.W., Atlanta, Georgia, telephone 404/681-2300 was contacted concerning his relationship with Gold Kist, Inc., and Billy Carter and the Libyan Government.

Mr. Schwind stated at the outset that he represents Billy Carter and Randy Coleman and advised that he was not at liberty to discuss the business affairs of his clients, citing the attorney client privilege.

He stated that he does not represent Gold Kist, Inc. When asked about the proposed agreement between World Wide Trading Corporation and Gold Kist, he cited the attorney client privilege mentioned above. He stated that he was not at liberty to discuss the relationship between World Wide Trading Corporation and Gold Kist.

The interview was at this point terminated.

This is to help to introduce to you Gold Kist Inc., a large multi-product agricultural cooperative with headquarters in Atlanta, Georgia. Our farmer members are producers and we are marketers, both in the domestic and export channels, of a range of commodities, including poultry, peanuts, soybean meal, soybean oil, and feed grains. Total company volume during the fiscal year just ended was \$1.7 billion and we expect volume for the current fiscal year to exceed \$2 billion. An important portion of this volume was for export.

Gold Kist is the largest fully-integrated processor of poultry with slaughter of approximately 1-million head per day. The cooperative is also the largest handler and sheller of peanuts in the United States, and the only handler/sheller operating in all three producing areas. With a crush of about 5,000 tons of soybean per day, Gold Kist is the largest cooperative crusher in the United States. Since we have been exporting for a number of years and maintain our own traffic and documentation section, we are fully familiar with and capable of handling all shipping and documentation matters.

I want to assure you of our great interest in exploring with you the possibilities for us becoming a supplier to Libya. We will be pleased to discuss any potential business with you at your convenience.

The records of the Corporation Department, Georgia Secretary of State, Atlanta, Georgia, reflect that Worldwide Trading Corporation was incorporated in Georgia, on June 23, 1978. The registered corporation agent is Jeffrey L. Lavine, 41 Marietta Street, Suite 809, Atlanta, Georgia. Since the corporation never filed a report reflecting such information, the names of officers or directors of the corporation are not reflected in the Corporation Department records.

[REDACTED] was advised by Special Agent (SA) [REDACTED] that this investigation relates to any relationships between Billy Carter, brother of President Carter, the Carter Warehouse, Gold Kist (GK), and the Government of Libya. b7c

Also, present in the interview at [REDACTED] request was [REDACTED] b

[REDACTED] advised as follows: b7c

He had been employed by GK from [REDACTED] in various capacities [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] had nothing to do with the arrangement, negotiations, or the subsequent implementation of the lease agreement between the Carter Warehouse and GK. b7c

He recalled the situation when he was asked to attend a meeting or orientation being held for the benefit of a group or delegation, numbering thirty to forty, from Libya at the Omni Hotel in Atlanta. [REDACTED] cannot recall specifically who requested him [REDACTED] to attend on behalf of GK but it may possibly have been [REDACTED] b7c

At the meeting held on that day [REDACTED] noted to be in attendance the Libyan delegation, Billy Carter, an aide to Billy Carter whom he believes may have been Randy Coleman, an International Lawyer (possibly [REDACTED]), a representative of the Georgia Board of Industry and Trade b7c

(possibly named [REDACTED], possibly a representative from the Georgia Power Company, and other unrecalled individuals. b7c

The meeting appeared to be more of a goodwill and social event with no discussions concerning trade agreements or of a political nature being discussed in [REDACTED] presence. b7c

Billy Carter remained in the back of the room, and [REDACTED] had no discussion with him. This was the only time [REDACTED] has seen Billy Carter in person. b7c

Near the conclusion of the meeting, [REDACTED] was approached by the aide to Billy Carter who requested that [REDACTED] make arrangements for the Libyan group to tour the Carter Warehouse in Plains, Georgia. [REDACTED] requested his [REDACTED] secretary to contact the appropriate GK official, possibly [REDACTED] who worked for [REDACTED] and determine if the tour was possible. Shortly thereafter, the secretary reported that the warehouse visit was approved. [REDACTED] at that time was involved in the GK peanut operation, and this was another reason he thought of [REDACTED] to arrange the tour. b7c

The meeting ended in the early afternoon. Although [REDACTED] could have attended an evening or night party with the group, he chose not to do so. b7c

[REDACTED] knew nothing about any proposed or actual commodity trade agreements between GK and the Libyan Government and/or the Carter Warehouse. b7c

Although it was possible that [REDACTED] may have given GK handouts at the meeting, he cannot recall specifically having done this.

[REDACTED] was the only GK representative who attended the Libyan function in Atlanta. b7c

He could not recall any of the Libyan delegation by name, but he did remember that the individuals between whom he sat at the dinner identified themselves as the head

of the Forestry College in Libya, a graduate of a Colorado university, and the other as a professor of agronomy in Libya.

[REDACTED] Georgia State Department of Industry and Trade, 1400 N. Omni International, telephone number 404/656-3529 was advised that the nature of this interview had to do with what if any was his connection with Billy Carter and Randy Coleman and the Libyan Delegation which visited Georgia in January of 1979. B7C

[REDACTED] stated that he had first become acquainted with Billy Carter shortly after the election of Jimmy Carter to President in that he [REDACTED] B7C

[REDACTED] The governor of Georgia had an impact study going with regards to the tourist in Plains and that he, [REDACTED] was a member of that study. He stated that he subsequently met Billy Carter in Plains who at one time had asked him to meet someone whom he felt would be a good employee for the visitors center. [REDACTED] stated that he recalled informing Billy that the building would have to be built first but that he did subsequently interview the lady who is now presently the manager of the information center.

[REDACTED] stated that he believed that sometime late in December, 1978, or early January, 1979, Billy contacted him about his possibly helping him with the Libyan Delegation. He could not recall whether it was Billy or Randy Coleman who first contacted him by telephone but that in all likelihood it had been Coleman who told him that Billy wanted to talk to him. [REDACTED] further added that all conversations of this nature took place either on the phone or in person in passing and that there was no correspondence which passed between he or Carter and Coleman. He indicated that this was Billy's usual way of doing things, on an informal basis. B7C

[REDACTED] stated that in response to Billy's request he informed him that he was not in the International Division of the department nor was he an official of the department. B7C

██████████ stated that he cannot recall whether he talked to the director of the department, ██████████ or the commissioner ██████████ or both about Billy's request but at any rate was told by them that in no way was the department to be involved and that the Libyan Delegation matter was a "hands off thing". They informed him that if he wished to be a part of the visit he was not to involve the department or mention the department's name and that all would be done on his own. He stated that he was further informed that if the department did have anything to do with the delegation it would have to come from the governor's office. b7c

At this point, ██████████ had checked his appointments book and advised that there was no indication of the date of the conversation regarding Billy's request for help from he or the department but that the calendar does show that on Monday, January 8, 1979, there is the notation, "foreign delegation", and a line through the 9th and 10th dates, then on Thursday, January 11, 1979, the notation, "Plains - Americus", then a squibble to the 12th of January with the word, "return". b7c

██████████ stated that he had been one of those that waited for the delegation's arrival at Hartsfield International Airport and that from the airport the group then traveled to the Hilton Hotel in downtown Atlanta. He stated that Billy and his wife as well as Randy Coleman and Mark Fuller, who subsequently became Billy's son-in-law, was also with the group. There was a welcoming group at the Hilton and various individuals from organizations in the business community spoke although he himself did not speak to the group. He did meet and speak with many people but to none of them in an official capacity in any way. He stated that subsequently there was a banquet or "fancy get together" at the Hilton Ballroom that evening. b7c

██████████ stated that the first few days of the delegation's arrival in town, the 8th, 9th and 10th of January, 1979, he would go to the Hilton during his free time such as at lunch time and after work merely to be "around" and that in his opinion Billy wanted someone whom he felt was in b7c



an official capacity to assist him and that his [redacted] mere presence made Billy feel more comfortable. [redacted] stated that even so, he had made it extremely clear to Billy that [redacted] was not there in an official capacity and that at one time even told him so again when Billy had attempted to introduce him to the press in his official capacity and then walked away from the group. b7c

[redacted] stated that he made the trip to Plains on January 11, 1979, by himself in his personal automobile and that he had gone to Plains [redacted] b7c

He met the group later that afternoon in Plains or Americus after he had completed his business. The group was in a recreational vehicle. He stated that he has no idea as to who the recreational vehicle belonged to and that in all probability, Billy or Randy had either rented or borrowed it. He also added that there may have possibly been 2 of the recreational vehicles and one or two cars. [redacted] stated that he then made himself a part of the group in one of the recreational vehicles and that the others in the vehicle he cannot recall by name but one was a Libyan whom he believes may have been a Minister of Tourism and another a Minister of Economics and Commerce or something of that nature. There were also 2 foreign ladies who were possibly these gentlemen's wives. Coleman was likewise in and out of the vehicle at all times either driving or merely alighting from the vehicle. [redacted] stated that the group was touring various places in the Plains, Georgia vicinity and that the only one he can actually recall was some type of a shirt factory. [redacted] also stated that to his recollection, [redacted] may also have been with them but that from his recollection it seems that [redacted] had informed him previously that he had another commitment to make but still it seems as though [redacted] was with the group. He added that [redacted] whose capacity he cannot recall at the time had been with the International Division of the Georgia State Department of Industry and Trade but has subsequently resigned from the department. b7c

[redacted] again stated that he had not been with the group the entire day or evening and that to his recollection left the group early in the evening and does not recall the group having traveled to Billy Carter's or Randy Coleman's b7c

residence nor does he recall any particular meetings as such. He added that to his recollection he probably returned early the morning of Friday, the 12th as he had an appointment at 8:30 that morning in Atlanta at the office.

[REDACTED] stated that other than the functions the first part of the week he had no other contact with the delegation and that to his recollection the last function of any nature was a press type of conference on Friday night or Saturday night the 12th or 13th of January, 1979, when the Libyan Delegation extended their appreciation for their visit and insisting that it was just a fact finding and observation type of visit and did not involve any business dealings, just a simple visit. [REDACTED] stated that it seems that the delegation left for a continued tour of the U. S. the next day or so. B7C

[REDACTED] stated that to his knowledge the Department of Industry and Trade at no time sponsored any official functions or became officially connected with the visit of the Libyan Delegation. Nor to his knowledge was there any correspondence between Carter and Coleman and [REDACTED] or [REDACTED] B7C

The first time the subject of Libyan oil ever came up between himself and Billy Carter was when Billy telephoned him from California, where he was under treatment in a hospital, and said during their phone conversation something like "By the way, I think I can get an oil allocation or allotment from the Libyans." This was March or April, 1979. The second time when they met face to face and Libyan oil was discussed, was in late April, 1979, and Billy again mentioned his anticipation of being able to get oil from the Libyans.

The third time Billy again initiated the contact and said that the "Libyans liked him and he believed that

they felt somewhat responsible for his financial problems and therefore they wanted to help him." These were the two reasons and the only reasons or basis for Billy's having told him that he could "get" Libyan oil in quantity over and above the flow already being "lifted" to the United States from Libya.

He asked Billy "two or three times" why he could get the oil and those were the only reasons given.

Billy did mention a name or two of Libyans he knew, but he [REDACTED] did not connect them with anyone he knew to be handling oil related matters in Libya.

"I may have mentioned this name to Louis Nasif, President of Charter Crude Oil Company in Jacksonville, Florida."

In this regard, he told Billy Carter "It's going to take (someone) in the Libyan National Oil Company to provide" any increases in oil allocations to the United States.

He also mentioned Charter Oil to Billy. Thus, he was the person who brought Billy Carter and Louis Nasif of Charter Crude, which is owned by Charter Oil Company, together.

He did so as Billy's friend, advisor, and because he [REDACTED] formerly worked for Carey Energy, which Charter acquired or has 20 per cent of at that time, and because he formed his own company, Hampton-Douglas Corporation, which deals with oil financing and because he was and still is a paid consultant to Charter Oil on regular retainer.

Another person he asked about Libyan oil was [REDACTED] address unknown, who lives in Brownsville, Texas, and is familiar with Libyan oil production.

The fourth meeting at which Libyan oil was discussed between himself and Billy Carter was when Louis Nasif, Billy Carter, Randy Coleman (Billy's associate), and he all met at Columbus, Georgia, and discussed it. Nasif was returning from overseas, and he met him in New York and they flew down to the meeting together in a Charter Company airplane. This was August 17, 1979.

Asked at this point what Coleman's involvement was with Billy, he stated: "I never heard of any business relationship between them."

At this meeting, agreement of Billy's commission was made in principle, but no contract between Billy and Charter was signed.

One or two phone calls followed, but no oil was ever delivered. Charter wrote Billy outlining the proposed contract of from 5 to 55 cents per barrel of oil "on a sliding scale" if the oil were "lifted."

Six or eight phone calls later, "I became disenchanted."

Asked in the interview what he told Nasif about Billy's ability to produce oil above and beyond current supplies at that time in a tight market, he told them (Charter): [REDACTED] b7c  
[REDACTED] Billy is "creditable, believable" and a "smart guy."

Asked at this point in the interview what his personal financial expectations were, he said he anticipated being compensated financially over and above his regular retainer fee if Billy got Charter an oil increase over and above what they were already getting.

In late June, 1979, he specifically recalls Billy Carter telling him: "Hell, I think the Libyans know I don't have any influence with the White House."

Billy never told him about his having received any money from the Libyans, and "I never considered him as representing an (foreign) oil producing country.
