### "Draft Suit Planned"

Dear Friends,

SDS is organizing now around a mass suit to be filed shortly in the Federal courts. The suit demands that those who have strong objection to this particular war in Vietnam be exempted from the draft. It is being filed by the Law Center in New York. Our goal is to have 30,000 sign as plaintiffs, and already work is going on to collect the names.

We feel that the suit has several advantages. If we are able to get a significant number of signers, it will have the effect of a very strong demand to end the war. If we lose the case, as almost certainly we will, many of the signers will refuse and perhaps demonstrations can be constructed around it to further show the de-legitimacy of the government's draft and war policy.

The suit also has the advantage that many will sign it who would not take the stronger stand of refusal--so it is a more broad-reaching tool. Signing the suit should in no way change or prejudice the signer's draft status. It may, however, provide him with a delay. If his induction comes up during the summer, a lawyer may very well (the chances are good) get him a delay of induction on the basis

that the mass suit has not been ruled on in the federal courts. The possibility of delay is a further inducement to get men to sign as plaintiffs in the case.

We are also trying to integrate signers into summer projects on the draft and on racism in the white community. If possible, signers should be encouraged to contact the SDS office here and we will attempt to point them to an ongoing summer project.

We will be happy to send a draft of the proposed brief and further information to any individual or organization interested in using this material. We are hoping for your cooperation and, especially, would ask that you keep us informed as to the kind of work you do or plan to do on the suit. Anita Hoffman, the spokesman for the group, stated  
that they were present to protest the FBI sending agents to  
their homes everyday for the past two weeks and harassing them.  
He stated that he had been subpoenaed along with Jerry Rubin,  
David Dellinger, Rennie Davis and Thomas Hayden by the HUAC.  
He stated that they also came to put "something" on the FBI  
door. He stated that "his agent, Mr. Scholl", asked him to  
come up to the FBI office to see him. He also stated that  
Tokyo Rose would put a leaflet on the FBI door.

Anita Hoffman, who identified herself as Tokyo  
Rose, was then observed attempting to post a leaflet on the  
FBI door which read as follows:

"We demand an end to the current wave of FBI  
harassment. If this does not cease Tokyo Rose will stage  
weekly Love-Ins in this building.
