Request received today from the White House for an investigation of captioned individual, who is being considered for Presidential appointment, position not stated.

A current issue of Who's Who indicates that Chancellor is a former newspaper reporter of the "Chicago Sun-Times" and since 1950 has been employed as a news commentator by the National Broadcasting Company.

A check of Bureau files does not indicate that we have had any contact with Chancellor. There is a reference which indicates that in December, 1964, he was one of six National Broadcasting Company correspondents which that company desired to send to Cuba to film a documentary on that country. In February, 1965, information was received that the Cuban Government denied them visas and there is no indication they actually went to Cuba.

**D.C. Lawyer
Is Praised as
'First Choice'
John Chancellor
Chosen to Head
Voice of America**

Abe Fortas, prominent Washington lawyer and longtime friend and adviser of President Johnson, today was nominated by the President to be an associate justice of the Supreme Court.

Describing the 55-year-old attorney as his "first choice," President Johnson sent the nomination to the Senate today to fill the vacancy left by the appointment of Justice Arthur J. Goldberg to be U.S. ambassador to the United Nations.

Johnson also announced that he is naming NBC White House Correspondent John W. Chancellor to be head of the Voice of America, the government's overseas radio.

Both nominations came as something of a surprise at Johnson's nationally televised news conference in the East Room of the White House.

"My First Choice"
In the past, Fortas had consistently refused to accept appointment to any government position "from president on down." It had been rumored that Johnson asked Fortas to take the Goldberg seat as soon as it became vacant but that Fortas refused.

Johnson told the press conference that Fortas was "my first choice."

"For many years I've regarded Fortas as a most able, respected and scholarly lawyer of superior ability, a champion," Johnson said.

"This opinion is shared by the legal profession, the bar, members of Congress and leaders of business and labor.

"Job Sought Man"

"He has told me in past months he would never accept any public appointment.

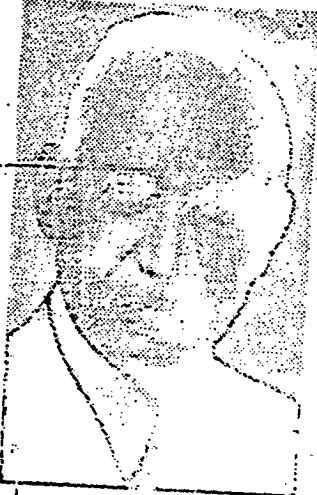
"This was a case where the job has sought the man."

Fortas has been a Johnson friend and adviser for many years as a member of the law firm of Arnold, Fortas and Porter with offices at 1229 19th St. NW. President Johnson has consulted Fortas on many problems—both governmental and private—over the years.

Despite his apparent aversion to public office, Fortas has been a government official in many capacities in the past. In the 1930s he was assistant director of a reorganization study of the Securities and Exchange Commission and consultant in the Public Administration.

He was director of the Division of Power of the Interior Department from 1941 to 1942 and undersecretary of the interior from 1942 to 1946. In addition he has been acting general counsel of the National Power Policy Commission; a member of the board of legal examiners of the Civil Service Commission from 1941 to 1943; a member of the presidential committee studying changes in the law of Puerto Rico, and adviser to the U.S. delegation when the United Nations was

Yale Law Graduate

Fortas was born in Memphis, Tenn., June 19, 1910, the son of William and Ray Berson, a Jewish family. He received his bachelor of arts degree at Southwestern College, Memphis, Tenn., in 1930 and his law degree at Yale University in 1933. He was the editor-in-chief of the Yale Law Journal.

Two years after graduation he was married to the former Carolyn Eugenia Agger.

For four years until 1937 he was assistant professor of law at Yale and also was assistant chief of the legal division of the Agricultural Adjustment Administration.

Fortas also has been a visiting lecturer on law at Yale and is a member of the federal, American and Federal Communications Commission bar associations and Phi Beta Kappa.

He is a director of a number of corporations and is a trustee of Carnegie Hall Corp., the Washington Gallery of Modern Art and the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts.

Chancellor Praised

Chancellor also came in for accolades from Johnson, who said of him:

"He is a man whose voice and whose face and whose mind is well known to this country and to most of the entire world."

Chancellor, 38, a native of Chicago, has been with the news department of NBC for the past 15 years. He has had assignments in Vienna, London, Moscow, New York, Brussels and Berlin. He has been covering the White House since 1964.

Perhaps his best known assignment was a tour as conductor of the "Today" show, an early morning pot pourri of interviews and news he took over from Dave Garroway and later relinquished to Hugh Downs.

"This, I think," Johnson said, "is the first time in the history of the voice of America that a working newspaperman, a respected commentator, an experienced, independent reporter has been given the responsibility of leadership and direction in this vital enterprise. I think he

understands the challenges that are present and the achievements that are possible."

Succeeds Loomis

Chancellor succeeds Henry Loomis, who recently resigned the Voice of America job.

It was Johnson's second appointment for the United States Information Agency, of which the Voice of America is a branch. The President has named Washington lawyer Leonard H. Marks as director of the USIA, succeeding Carl T. Rowan.

Johnson said he was satisfied that the Voice of America under Chancellor would be in "imaginative, competent, reliable and always truthful hands."

Johnson said the Voice of America assignment is in the front rank of importance to the freedom of the world — an important national asset, telling the truth to this world, telling an exciting story, is the Voice of America.

In accordance with memorandum from C. D. DeLoach to Mr. Mohr dated August 11, 1965 (attached), supervisors in the Employees Security and Special Inquiry Section of this Division have been questioned and it was determined that [redacted] telephonically contacted SA [redacted] on August 6, 1965, inasmuch as SA [redacted] is supervisor in charge of the Case Review - Civil Service Commission Unit, which unit handles investigations of United States Information Agency (USIA) employees. He stated the White House had informed him that they had requested the Bureau to conduct an investigation of Chancellor and that he had to issue a clearance for him under Public Law 298. (Personnel Clearance Law pertaining to USIA personnel.) SA [redacted] who had no knowledge of the case, checked with the writer and thereafter told [redacted] that as he knew, when investigations are requested by the White House, the FBI furnishes the results directly to the White House and consequently his request would have to be made through official channels.

It would appear from the attached memorandum that the President, Marvin Watson and John Macy are under the impression that the FBI is the only one who has knowledge of Chancellor's arrest record. In this connection, the following items are of interest:

(2) [REDACTED] has in the past obtained the results of investigations conducted for the White House through official channels during the Johnson Administration on a number of occasions. He knows that to do this, a letter must be addressed to the White House requesting the information, which letter is forwarded by [REDACTED] to the Bureau, and the results of our investigation are returned with the letter to [REDACTED] by Liaison. He knows that since he has been refused the results of the Chancellor investigation, there must be something wrong. As pointed out in Mr. DeLoach's memorandum (attached), there have been a number of cases where derogatory information was developed wherein the White House would refuse to furnish the employing agency copies of our summaries. A further example of this would be [REDACTED]

The facts regarding his false statement were presented to the United States Attorney, District of Columbia, who withheld prosecutive opinion until written reports were received. The White House has never permitted the furnishing of these reports to the United States Attorney, and as a matter of fact, they have also refused to authorize furnishing statements in this case to the Department of Defense.

(3) Information regarding Chancellor's arrests was in the newspapers and continues to be available to anyone who bothers to check the newspaper morgues.

(4) During our investigation of Chancellor, 68 people were interviewed, 17 of whom volunteered information regarding one or more of Chancellor's arrests. Ten of these 17 persons are present or former employees of the news media. Undoubtedly many others that we talked to had knowledge of these arrests but withheld it during our interview. [REDACTED] Washington, D. C., who was [REDACTED] and Chancellor's [REDACTED] in Chicago, Illinois, at the time of his arrests, frankly told interviewing Agents that he would not have admitted he knew of Chancellor's arrests had he not been pinned down and asked about them point blank.

(5) The [REDACTED] at the time of Chancellor's arrest on the fire escape in May, 1951, is [REDACTED] Chicago, Illinois. He claimed he had "heard stories" from sources, the identities of which he does not now recall, which indicate that Mr. Chancellor "may have" homosexual tendencies.

(6) Two established informants of the Chicago Office, one a homosexual, reported that Chancellor is known in homosexual circles in Chicago as "one of us and friendly to us."

(7) After Chancellor's nomination was announced in the newspapers, an unidentified Chicago policeman called our Chicago Office and furnished information regarding Chancellor's arrests.

ACTION:

For information.

From the above, it is clear that there is widespread knowledge concerning Chancellor's arrests in the files of other Government agencies, in the Identification Records of the Chicago Police Department, in newspaper morgues, in homosexual circles and throughout the news media. From the above, it is clear that the FBI is not the only agency having knowledge concerning Chancellor's arrest record and as pointed out in Mr. DeLoach's memorandum (attached) the fact that the results of our investigation have been withheld from the employing agency, after having been informed by the White House that they had requested the Bureau to conduct an investigation of Chancellor, immediately arouses suspicion.

[REDACTED] are persons applying for positions with the United States Information Agency. These cases are handled under Public Law 298 - Civil Service Commission initiates the investigation and if they develop subversive ~~and~~ derogatory information they refer the case to the Bureau for completion.

In ~~an~~ connection with USIA cases [REDACTED] receive calls from [REDACTED] of the USIA as to the status of the case and when he will receive the results, particularly on expedite cases, [REDACTED] to give clearances to those persons under Public Law 298

On August 6, 1965, [REDACTED] called [REDACTED] the White House had informed him they had requested the Bureau to conduct an investigation of John Chancellor. [REDACTED] to issue a clearance for Chancellor under Public Law 298. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] was not handling the case and as he knew when the White House requests an investigation we furnish the results directly to the White House and any information he wanted regarding ~~the~~ the progress of the investigation would have to be made through official channels.

At the time [REDACTED] I personally did not know the Bureau was conducting an investigation of Chancellor and knew nothing of the facts in the case.

Bureau files reflect we previously did a name check on captioned individual. Shortly thereafter, Marvin Watson called me and stated the President desired a full field investigation conducted immediately. He added that the President planned to go ahead and name Chancellor as Director of the Voice of America without waiting for the full field investigation to be completed. Watson told me that the President was satisfied on the basis of the name check and that the President had personally known Chancellor for years, consequently there was no need to wait for completion of the full field investigation.

I told Watson that the President was needlessly going out on a limb and that it was dangerous business to announce an appointment without having the benefit of a full field investigation. Watson stated that the President was adamant in his views and that he would not wait. A memorandum is in the file reflecting this conversation.

The Director transmitted to Watson by letter dated August 6, 1965, delivered the same date, the results of the full field investigation on Chancellor. (Copy attached.) Our investigation reflects 4 arrests in Chicago, Illinois. Two of the arrests, 3/27/49 and 3/18/49, reflect charges of drunkenness. Of those arrests, one disposition indicated "discharged" and the second disposition indicated "bond forfeiture." The third and fourth arrests, 2/11/51 and 5/10/51, reflect charges of "disorderly conduct." Chancellor was found on the roof of a local hotel in one of those arrests and the disposition was "discharged." In the fourth and final arrest, Chancellor was found on a fire escape of an apartment building. There was no additional information concerning this latter arrest. While there was no substantive information to indicate homosexuality, it would appear that Chancellor could have been a "peeping tom." One homosexual indicated to the Agents that, "Mr. Chancellor is known in homosexual circles as one of us and friendly to us."

On 8/6/65, I told Watson of the above-mentioned facts and handed him the report. I mentioned that while there was no substantive evidence to indicate Chancellor was a homosexual, his file nevertheless clearly indicated sufficient evidence to reflect on his character.

[redacted] called me 8/10/65 and stated that the President had reviewed Chancellor's file and had forwarded it to her for filing in a closed envelope. She stated the President had made no comment regarding the matter. She added, however, that Leonard Marks, Director, Voice of America, had confided to her that his [redacted], was insisting that he see the results of the FBI investigation on Chancellor. U S I A

Watson called me at 12:30 p. m., 8/11/65, and asked that I join him and John Macy, Chairman of the Civil Service Commission, in his office at 2:30 p. m. He stated it was a matter of some importance.

Upon joining Watson and Macy in Watson's office, Watson told me that Leonard Marks had seen the President on 3 separate occasions within the past 2 days. Watson indicated that Marks had greatly upset the President concerning the Chancellor case. He added that Marks had told the President that the Security Officer at U. S. Information Agency had advised him that contacts in the FBI with whom he was in daily communication had told him that the Chancellor investigation had been completed and that there was some question as to Chancellor's morals. The President told Watson to tell me that FBI personnel had no right or authority to "tip off" employees of other Federal agencies regarding matters affecting Presidential appointees. Watson stated the President wanted me to find out if the allegations concerning an FBI employee were correct and that, while the President did not want anything to be submitted to him in writing, he wanted to know the outcome of our inquiry into this matter. I told Watson that I would, of course, immediately check into it and that I would verbally, in accordance with instructions, let him know the results.

Watson stated that the President had also instructed him to tell me that I was to sit down and prepare an analysis of the Chancellor file indicating that there was nothing wrong with Chancellor and there appeared to be no reason why he should not be continued in his job. I told Watson that while I of course wanted to abide by the President's instructions, that it certainly appeared to be a little out of the ordinary for me to "clear" anyone, particularly in the Chancellor case. I reminded Watson that it was the President's decision to go ahead and appoint Chancellor without waiting for the full field investigation to be completed. Watson stated that this was true, however, nevertheless the President wanted a statement from the FBI to put in Chancellor's file.

I suggested to Watson that John Macy, who was present, and I sit down and review this file and draw up an analysis for the President. Watson agreed and stated this would be sufficient. He asked that we have this analysis prepared by 5:15 p. m. that day, 8/11/65. Macy and I retired to Macy's office and there prepared a brief 4-paragraph memorandum reflecting that we had thoroughly reviewed Chancellor's file and that while there had been 4 different arrests of Chancellor there appeared to be nothing of a subversive nature in the file and there was no substantial proof of homosexuality; however, there had been 2 arrests involving possible immorality. Macy stated that in his opinion there was no reason to question Chancellor's background as a result of the investigation.

Watson indicated satisfaction with the above-mentioned analysis and placed the Chancellor file on the President's desk. Watson then reminded me that the President desired to know as expeditiously as possible the results of the inquiry regarding the alleged "tip off" made to the Security Officer at U. S. Information Agency by FBI personnel. I told Watson this would be handled today, 8/11/65.

When the Director inquired telephonically as to the reasons for my being called to the White House, I furnished him the above facts. He instructed that this inquiry be conducted on an expeditious basis and that he should be advised as to the results of the inquiry.

The [redacted] at U. S. Information Agency is [redacted]. He entered on duty [redacted] and resigned as of [redacted]. His services were satisfactory and his file shows that as of 9/23/64 he is on the Special Correspondents' List.

Upon leaving the White House, Watson asked Macy upon what authority the [redacted] at U. S. Information Agency would have to demand the Chancellor file. Macy told Watson that it would be Leonard Marks prerogative to tell the [redacted] that he, Marks, the Director of U. S. Information Agency, was perfectly satisfied with Chancellor's background investigation and there should be no doubt as to his clearance. Watson stated he intended to advise Marks of this fact so that there would be no further interference from [redacted], the [redacted].

Watson also inquired of Macy and me as to the action that would be taken when Chancellor submitted his Form 86 in connection with the Federal Employees Security Program. I told Watson that the Form, upon receipt at the FBI, would be stamped "No subversive derogatory information." I told him with respect to the criminal type information on Chancellor that this would not be released unless the White House gave its permission. Watson stated that this file was being sealed and that the White House would not give permission for the file to be transferred to the

[redacted] at the U. S. Information Agency. I told him that under those circumstances we would indicate on Chancellor's form that there was no subversive information and that the U. S. Information Agency would have to contact the White House for further information concerning his file. Watson stated that this matter would of course clean up the entire case inasmuch as Marks, the Director, would tell the [redacted] that he was not going to need this file.

OBSERVATIONS: It is commonplace for the White House to withhold files from Federal agencies, particularly when there are derogatory facts contained in such files. The Kennedy administration did this in many instances, [redacted] Adlai Stevenson file [redacted] and others. Usually when such files are withheld, immediately suspicion is aroused by the very fact that the employing agency is not allowed to peruse the file. This may have happened in this particular instance. However, the Director, Marks, claims that [redacted] specifically told him that FBI contacts had tipped him off that the Chancellor investigation had been completed and that a morals problem was involved. Consequently, we must interview anyone that is in contact with [redacted] relative to FBI matters. Supervisors in the Liaison Section, Domestic Intelligence Division, as well as Supervisors in the Special Inquiry Section, Special Investigative Division, are in contact with [redacted]. Interviews with the appropriate Agent Supervisors will be conducted tonight, 8/11/65, and memoranda prepared accordingly. The Director then will be advised as to the results and permission will be requested to advise the White House regarding our inquiries.

John Chancellor of N.B.C. Named Director of the Voice of America

Johnson Selects White House Reporter as First Working Newsmen in the Post

WASHINGTON, July 28—

John W. Chancellor, White House correspondent for the National Broadcasting Company, was named by President Johnson today to head the Voice of America.

The 38-year-old reporter and broadcaster succeeds Henry Loomis, the long-time director of the Government's overseas radio, who resigned last March with a charge that the Voice was losing credibility because of an overdose of propaganda.

This controversy, was discussed in connection with Mr. Chancellor's appointment. Reliable sources said that he and President Johnson had talked at length on the role of the Voice and that Mr. Chancellor would be free to emphasize the "good as well as the bad" in the treatment of United States affairs.

In a farewell address to Voice employes, Mr. Loomis contended that the Voice's reputation for objectivity was being undercut because the United States Information Agency, which has overall responsibility for overseas broadcasts, was insisting

that news commentaries reflect and reinforce Administration policies and de-emphasize dissenting opinion.

Carl T. Rowan, the head of U.S.I.A., countered that news reports of the Voice had the same "judicial balance" of the favorable and unfavorable "that a responsible newspaper gives."

Mr. Rowan later resigned as U.S.I.A. director and on July 13 Mr. Johnson named Leonard Marks, a Washington communications lawyer, to succeed him.

In announcing Mr. Chancellor's appointment at his news conference today, President Johnson said:

"I have confidence that the Voice of America is going to be imaginative, competent, reliable and always truthful hands." [opening statement, page 12.]

Reached at his Cleveland Park home after the announcement, Mr. Chancellor talked of propaganda as being "a two-way word."

"Of course we want to project American policy," he said. "But we also have to admit our own problems. If we try to brush something under the rug and Radio Moscow is covering it in their broadcasts then we lose our audience."

"Our main weapon is our own mistakes and solve our own problems out in the open. We can't be Buddha-like."

Admired by Johnson

Mr. Chancellor first came to the President's attention as the White House correspondent for N.B.C., an assignment he has held for the last year.

Newsmen who have worked with Mr. Chancellor both here and abroad have long rated him as an outstanding, enterprising reporter. The President is known to share this judgment.

Those close to the White House recount one occasion when President Johnson took time out during a vacation outing just to catch a Chancellor broadcast on television and while watching explained to intimates: "Now there's an intelligent young man. I can't think of anyone I enjoy talking to more than John Chancellor."

Being director of the Voice is a \$24,500 a year job of overseeing the writing and broadcasting of news, commentaries and features 800 hours a week in 37 languages over a worldwide network. In leaving N. B. C., Mr. Chancellor conceded he was taking "a substantial" salary cut.

In announcing Mr. Chancellor's appointment, Mr. Johnson said that the new director would be the first working newsman to head the Voice agency.

A native of Chicago, Mr. Chancellor quit the University of Illinois in his junior year to work as a copy boy for The Chicago Sun-Times.

He joined N.B.C.'s Chicago news bureau in 1950 and later won a Sigma Delta Chi journalism award for a taped broadcast describing the capture of a man who killed a policeman. Mr. Chancellor made the report lying on his back in the street while policemen and the cornered man shot it out over his head.

The following account of my activities in connection with captioned matter is submitted in response to your request:

In my capacity as [REDACTED] the United States Information Agency, I was in discussion with [REDACTED] at 5:00 p.m., 8/11/65. While so engaged, [REDACTED] mentioned instant case stating that he had requested the results of FBI investigation in instant matter from the White House and in this connection showed me a memorandum Mr. Marvin Watson, White House, to Mr. Marks (newly appointed Director of the U. S. Information Agency) stating that it is the policy of the White House to retain the reports where the President has named a person to an official position.

[REDACTED] pointed out that this position is not subject to Senate confirmation and that [REDACTED] to grant a clearance for access to classified information, had nothing [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] advised that he had in his possession FBI summaries received from the White House in similar cases and indicated his intention of recontacting Mr. Watson with these to resolve the matter of clearance. As he always received relevant summaries before, he thought it strange the White House was making an exception in the Chancellor case. His remarks were very brief, taking about two to three minutes. [REDACTED] was in the room at the same time and heard and witnessed the conversation. Absolutely no references were made to moral issues or any other aspects of the case.

At no time have I had access to, or knowledge of, the results of our investigation in the Chancellor case. I knew nothing about the case and, therefore, was incapable of discussing it even if the matter had been raised, which it was not.

Re memorandum Felt to Tolson this date. Referenced memorandum pointed out the results of my interview with *[Redacted]* of the U. S. Information Agency today. Subsequent to preparing referenced memorandum, *[Redacted]* contacted me telephonically to furnish the following information.

[Redacted] said that after my departure he contacted Leonard Marks, Director of the U. S. Information Agency, concerning allegations made by Marvin Watson at the White House. Marks told *[Redacted]* emphatically that he had made no such statements to Watson. Marks telephonically contacted Watson and so stated and then placed *[Redacted]* on the phone. Watson told *[Redacted]* that he had no information that *[Redacted]* had raised any question concerning the suitability of Chancellor and said he was only concerned about the pressure being applied to get copies of the FBI report.

[Redacted] advised that he again raised the question of clearance for Chancellor and the need for reviewing the FBI report prior to issuing same. Watson advised that the report was not being furnished to the U. S. Information Agency and told *[Redacted]* he could quote him, Watson, that Chancellor was being given the necessary clearance.

OBSERVATION

It appears that this matter has been resolved so far as the Bureau is concerned. For this reason there is no need for interview of Marks as recommended in my previous memorandum.

ADDENDUM: Crime Records Division, (CDD:bpk)

[redacted] advised me in strict confidence at 3:20 p. m., 8-12 65, that she had discussed this matter telephonically with Leonard Marks for approximately twenty minutes last night, 8-11-65. She stated that Marks had told her that his [redacted] was a "regular cop"-- that he had been snooping around the FBI and was now insisting that [redacted] Chancellor's file be furnished to him.

Marvin Watson advised DeLoach at approximately 2:20 p. m. today, 8-12-65, that the USIA Director, Marks, had called him a few minutes earlier. The [redacted] was in Marks' office at the time of the call to Watson. Marks put [redacted] on the phone. According to Watson, [redacted] told him that he, [redacted] was completely satisfied regarding the Chancellor matter and that he no longer desired to raise any issue. Watson stated that [redacted] bent over backwards to be courteous and that he had apologized for being "pushy." Marks then came on the phone. He reputedly told Watson that the FBI had paid [redacted] a visit this morning. Marks stated that in conversation with the President and Watson he had not meant to infer that the FBI had "leaked" any information. Marks told Watson that the entire matter was settled--that Chancellor was now cleared and there would be no further difficulty.

Watson told me that under the circumstances we should not make any further inquiries. He stated that both he and the President were satisfied, that the FBI had handled this matter in good fashion and there had been no "leaks." I told Watson that we had checked very carefully and had determined that none of our people had given [redacted] any information relative to Chancellor's morals. I further told him that following his approval we had pinned down [redacted] this morning and that [redacted] had unequivocally denied that he had received any information from the FBI. I told Watson that [redacted] had further denied that he had told Marks that he had received information from the FBI. I mentioned that under the circumstances it definitely and conclusively was proven that the FBI was not responsible for any so-called "leaks."

Watson stated that he agreed and would so advise the President. He told me that Marks, although a close personal friend of long standing to the President, [redacted] Watson stated that with respect to the above matter the President had called Marks last night and flatly told him that "if [redacted] [redacted] The President also told Marks he would give him [redacted]"




John Chancellor, newly named director of the Voice of America, is the "first working newspaperman to head the agency," according to President Johnson, who made the appointment. (E&P, July 31.)

As director, Mr. Chancellor will oversee the writing and broadcasting of news, commentaries and features 800 hours a week in 37 languages over a world-wide network.

He brings to this job his 15 years of experience as a news correspondent for National Broadcasting Company and a brief stint prior to that as reporter, rewrite man and feature writer for the *Chicago Sun-Times*.

A colleague recalled that John had "gotten the ax" with several others in a retrenchment move at Easter, 1950. He went to work as a leg man for NBC commentators in Chicago.

Before he was assigned to the White House in September, 1964, Mr. Chancellor scored many firsts as a national convention reporter.

His most famous, broadcasting his own arrest, took place during the Republican convention. He refused to move when an assistant sergeant-at-arms ordered the aisles cleared.

This is what happened:

"I'm not moving," Mr. Chancellor said. "Are you going to carry me out?"

"We have been instructed to remove you," said a policeman.

Mr. Chancellor looked up at the cameras and said, "The next move in this drama is up to the cops.

"Badge number 38 now has his heavy hand on my elbow. Here we go.

"It's awfully hard to remain dignified at a time like this," Mr. Chancellor said as he was ushered out.

Retained Sense of Humor

As he approached the exit, he laughingly reported to the viewers, "Don't worry, NBC has plenty of other reporters here to continue coverage."

Then he disappeared from the screen his voice came out of

"This is John Chancellor—somewhere in custody."

Within a few minutes the dis-

pute was settled and he was back at his post on the convention floor.

Mr. Chancellor has also served overseas in NBC News bureaus in Vienna, London, Moscow and Brussels. His reporting has won him a Sigma Delta Chi award and a Robert E. Sherwood award.

Newsmen who have worked with him both here and abroad rate him as an outstanding, enterprising reporter. The President is known to share this judgment.

Admired by President

Those close to the White House recount one occasion when President Johnson took time out during a vacation outing just to catch a Chancellor broadcast on television. While watching he commented: "Now there's an intelligent young man. I can't think of anyone I enjoy talking to more than John Chancellor."

In announcing Mr. Chancellor's appointment at his news conference July 28, the President said:

"I am satisfied that the Voice of America will be in imaginative, competent, reliable and always truthful hands."

In the latter role he contributed additional information from personal observation gathered from his cross-country travels and meetings with key local political personalities in advance of the conventions. Previously, Chancellor had covered every Presidential campaign and all but one important off-year election for NBC News since 1950.

Later that year he spent two-and-a-half months covering the Lebanese civil war. Assigned to the London Bureau, he ranged as far as the Khyber Pass, to Afghanistan and to the Mediterranean. In mid-1960 he was named chief of NBC News' Moscow Bureau, where he covered the trial of Francis Gary Powers and other important stories.

During his Moscow tour of duty, he returned to the United States to work on NBC News' coverage of the 1960 elections. He traveled with the candidates and interviewed them on "The Great Debates," in addition to handling the Midwest Desk on Election Night.

He went back to Moscow, and returned to the U. S. again in July, 1961, to become host of NBC-TV's "Today" program for one year, living in New York. He spent the balance of 1962 analyzing and reporting on political developments in the Far West during the election campaigns. In that role he traveled in six West Coast states, visiting the state capitals, gathering facts on election laws, election trends and the candidates themselves. He was also anchor man for "The Campaign and the Candidates" series of pre-election TV specials and reported developments from the Far West on Election Night.

Chancellor returned to Europe early in 1963 to study the Common Market, and reported on it in a widely acclaimed special, "A Country Called Europe." In July he was named head of the NBC News bureau covering the Common Market in Brussels. He returned to the U.S. early in 1964 to begin preparation for his floor reporter assignment at the conventions.

Born in Chicago in 1927, Chancellor attended local schools and the University of Illinois. After service in the Army, he joined the Chicago Sun-Times in 1948 and for two years filled varied assignments as reporter, rewrite man and feature writer before starting his career in broadcasting. He is married to the former Barbara Upshaw. They have two children: Laura, four, and Barnaby, three.

Marvin Watson called from the White House on the morning of 7/27/65 and asked if we had any information on the captioned individual. I told him that ██████████ had called over on Monday, 7/26/65, with a request that a full field investigation be started on this same person. I told Watson that ██████████ had requested a name check on Chancellor on Saturday, 7/10/65, and that a memorandum had been furnished to her regarding this matter. I told Watson that while a check of files and a check of the Identification Division had shown no identifiable derogatory information, this, of course, did not mean that a full field investigation would not reflect derogatory information. Watson replied that the President was in a hurry and wanted to name Chancellor as Director of the Voice of America within the next several hours. He asked if I could determine if the full field investigation had reflected anything derogatory thus far. I told him it was too early to determine this, that our leads in this matter had just been sent out. Watson stated that he felt the President would go ahead and name Chancellor anyhow. I told him this, of course, was entirely up to the President; however, I thought it was a dangerous practice.
