[REDACTED] stated he felt more certain of Mr. KETTERING's loyalty than any other individual he knows. [REDACTED] further stated he would unreservedly recommend the Applicant so far as character, reputation, and loyalty are concerned.

[REDACTED] who was described by [REDACTED] as being a close friend of the Applicant for the past [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] who has known the Applicant [REDACTED] advised the Applicant is a patriotic American whose loyalty is above question. Both persons advised that they considered his character and associates to be of the very best and they considered Mr. KETTERING to be an exceptionally high type man from every possible viewpoint.

Reference, [REDACTED] Henry Ford Hospital, Detroit, Michigan, has known Mr. KETTERING [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] further stated he considered Mr. KETTERING's character and associations to be above question. [REDACTED] said Mr. KETTERING has proven his loyalty to the United States time after time and he personally would stake his life on KETTERING's loyalty to the United States.

Kettering Dies; Top Inventor

DAYTON, Ohio, Nov. 25 (UPI). —Charles F. Kettering, 82, inventor of the automobile self-starter, died at his home at nearby Kettering today as a result of a stroke suffered Sunday night.



Dr. Charles F. Kettering

The condition of Kettering, known affectionately as "Boss Ket" during his career at General Motors, had worsened steadily since the stroke. Kettering's only son, Eugene, was at the bedside of his father.

A DIRECTOR and former vice president of General Motors and former general manager of the General Motors Research Laboratories, Kettering was born on a farm near Loudonville, Ohio, on Aug. 29, 1876.

Kettering's innovations ranged from putting the ethyl in gasoline, to building a fever machine that promises relief from many human ailments.

Doctors listed the cause of death as a cerebral hemorrhage. Kettering never regained consciousness after suffering a second stroke early today and falling into a coma.

The towering Sloan-Kettering Institute for cancer research, founded with his long-time General Motors boss Alfred P. Sloan Jr. in 1945, stands in New York's Memorial Center as a monument to Kettering's conviction that no problem can resist the patient, continued application of man's ingenuity and shirt-sleeved tinkering.

As you recall, Mr. Hoover received on April 28, 1958, from the U. S. Chamber of Commerce, one of the "Seven Great Living Americans" awards. Ceremonies were held at the Sheraton-Park Hotel in Washington. One of those so honored at the time was Charles F. Kettering who died today. Others were ~~4-year-old school teacher.~~ Miss Calla Varner.

Mr. Kettering died at 82 in Dayton today. His home address is Ridgeleigh Terrace, Dayton, Ohio. (According to the Associated Press, his wife died in 1946 and his only son, Eugene Kettering, resides at Hinsdale, Illinois.)

DEVELOPMENT:

We are having a letter sent to the son. At 5:25 p. m. today, Dick Cull of the "Dayton News," who is extremely friendly to the Bureau and who attended the "Seven Great Living Americans" awards ceremonies, telephoned Wick and asked whether Mr. Hoover would have anything to say about the life and death of Mr. Kettering.
