Governance

- The Interim Iraqi Government (IIG) was announced on June 01 and the Iraqi Governing Council (IGC) was dissolved
 - CPA will transfer sovereignty to the IIG on Jun 30
- Head of the UN's electoral team announced the formation of an Independent Election Commission (IEC) on Jun 04
 - The IEC will guide the country towards the elections in Jan 2005
 - A proportional representation system will be used for elections to the National Assembly with the country treated as a single district
- CPA and the International Republican Institute facilitated the first meeting of 500 tribal Sheikhs to develop a Supreme Council of Iraqi Tribes
- The Iraqi Property Claims Commission (IPCC) has 19 Offices open
 - Ramadi, Qadissiah, Samarra and Nasiriyah offices due to open this month
- Sixteen Ministries have transitioned to full Iraqi control as of Jun 2

Strategic Communication

- To date, over 10,000 Democracy Development Activities (DDA) program activities have been held in communities across Iraq, involving more than 312,000 participants
 - Has stimulated civic participation and increased Iraqis' understanding of the Transitional Administrative Law (TAL) and basic democratic principles
- Other activities continue in support of political transition and the Transitional Administrative Law (TAL) including:
 - Distribution of booklets and leaflets on the TAL
 - Numerous focus groups, seminars, public forums, and town hall meetings across Iraq
- CPA and USAID continue to undertake extensive activities providing assistance to Iraqi women, including:
 - Establishment of women's centers
 - Vocational training and education programs
 - Civic education and participation





Essential Services - Water and Sanitation

- A substantial increase in the number of Iraqis with access to potable water should result as work on a number of water treatment plants and systems is completed in the second half of the year:
 - Baghdad's Shark Dijlah plant will benefit 750,000 (Aug)
 - Sweet Water Canal and Basrah's 14 water treatment plants will benefit 1,750,000 residents (Aug)
 - Ad Diwaniyah plant will benefit more than 80,000 (Aug)
 - An Najaf plant will benefit 560,000 (Aug)
 - Ninawa' Governorate plants (10 out 67) will benefit 50,000 (Jun 04)
 - Fallujah will benefit more than 200,000 people (Jun)
- The Baghdad Water Department has reinstated billing for water services for the first time since late 2002




Essential Services - Telecommunications

Essential Services - Transportation


- Reconstruction of Baghdad International Airport (BIAP) and other activities continue in preparation for commercial operations and increased traffic
 - BIAP transition timeline commenced on Jun 01 with Iraqi Air Traffic
 Control (ATC) taking over the civilian side of airport operations
 - Work is expected to be complete by Aug 04
- The Minister of Transportation (MOT) is in the process of reconstructing Iraq's national aviation system to meet International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO) standards
- For the week of 17 23 May, the daily average number of civilian departures were reported as follows:
 - Baghdad International Airport 28, Basrah 3, and Mosul 12
- Port Umm Qasr received 50 ships in Apr and over 40 in May, dredging of the port continues

Essential Services - Food Security

- Chart below shows % of estimated requirements for Public Distribution System (PDS) goods from Apr - Jul 01
- Requirement includes stocks sufficient for the period and a three month buffer by **Jul 01**
- While substantial additional shipments of most goods have been procured, they are not shown as these shipments will arrive after Jul 01



CPA Food Security Objective: Provide Food Security for all Iraqis

Enhance capacity of Ministry of Agriculture • Assure supply of inputs • Strengthen research system • Ensure adequate stocks for Public Distribution System (PDS) • Monitor food security • Hand over administration of system in the North • Initiate reform of rations basket • Environmental Initiatives



Essential Services - Food Security (cont)

- Food stocks are low, however no disruptions in rations are anticipated through the summer and the three-month buffer supply is expected to be achieved
- Security concerns have prevented movement of wheat from ports to silos and warehouses, however no shortages are apparent and May rations were met
 - Current supply estimated at 15 days down from 50 days in early Apr
 - Over 500,000 metric tons of wheat will be delivered in Jun and July
 - Depending on security, stock levels should increase with new deliveries
 - Flour procurement and domestic wheat available in Jul are expected to help mitigate any shortfalls
- Rice rations are being fully met and nearly 250,000 metric tons is scheduled for delivery in Jun and Jul (monthly requirement is 80,000 metric tons)

Essential Services - Health Care

- It is estimated that 85% of Iraqi children have now been immunized
- 240 Iraqi hospitals and over 1,200 preventive health clinics are operating
 - Several primary health care centers and the Ibn Al Baladi hospital in Sadr City are to be renovated and task orders have been issued
 - Preliminary design work for the Ibn Al Baladi hospital and four Baghdad maternity-children hospitals were due to begin last week
 - Task order to renovate all maternity-children hospitals in the southern governorates is awaiting final signature from the Minister of Health
 - Iraqi non-governmental organizations are using USAID assistance to rehabilitate health facilities throughout the country
- As part of the Ministry of Health (MOH)'s efforts address drug shortages:
 - Two shipments of the initial emergency drug purchase received and one more shipment due to arrive last week
 - Delivery of a second emergency drug purchase expected mid-Jul

Essential Services - Education


- Primary, intermediate, and secondary students have been completing their final examinations for the school year
- Student attendance for the year was at or above pre-war levels and female enrollment was estimated to be over 40% of total enrollments
- To date, over 32,000 secondary school teachers and 3,000 supervisors have been trained as part of effort to upgrade the quality of education
 - Includes modern teaching methods, curriculum development, and promoting change in teaching philosophies
- Nearly 2500 schools have been rehabilitated to date and an additional 1,200 are expected to be complete by the end of the year

CPA Education Objective: Improve Quality and Access to Education

- Reorganize and staff the Ministry of Education;
- Rehabilitate school buildings and build new schools
- Advance national dialog on curriculum reform
- Continue and expand teacher training



Economy

- On 31 May, estimated crude oil export revenue was over \$6.8B for 2004
- In Jan, the Ministry of Planning reported a national unemployment rate of 28% and an underemployment rate of 21.6%
- Iraq's annualized inflation rate for Apr was 19.6%, down from its peak of 47.7% in Oct 03
 - Over past six months the CPI has risen by 3.5%, or 7.0% at an annual rate
- The Trade Bank of Iraq has issued 238 letters of credit, totaling approximately \$900M, and covering imports from 36 countries
- The New Iraqi Dinar was at 1,460 dinars per dollar on 27 May, and has been relatively stable for over three months
- The Iraqi Stock Exchange is due to open in mid-Jun
- Micro-credit loans now total almost \$5M, with 2,500 clients

Accelerated Iraqi Reconstruction Program (AIRP)

- New Accelerated Iraq Reconstruction Program (AIRP) is underway to meet urgent local needs in 18 Iraqi cities
- Projects and requirements were developed as a joint effort between CPA, PMO, various US and Iraqi agencies, and local community leadership
- Projects cover: water and sanitation, health, education, building, roads, power, telecommunications, and various others
- Benefits of the AIRP include:
 - Expected to employ 4,000 Iraqis by 30 Jun
 - Jump starts community essential services construction
 - \$250 million under contract by 30 Jun (\$142 million as at Jun 02)
 - Rapid execution and impact
 - Over 160 urgent, high profile projects
 - Stimulates local economy
 - Provides opportunities for local businesses
 - Improves Iraqi's quality of life



Electricity Overview




- Ambassador Bremer approved an increase plan in Jan to reach 6,000 MW of peak deliverable capacity and 120,000 MWH of daily production by 01 Jun. Due to unforeseen problems, these goals will slip until 30 Jun
- CPA spring maintenance program continues resulting in about 1,200 MW of generation capacity currently offline for scheduled and about 440 MW for unscheduled maintenance



Mega Watt Hour Production









Crude Oil Production





Crude Oil Exports


Monthly Average of Crude Oil Exports


Diesel Supply



• This week's average production and imports are 80% of goal




Kerosene Supply

This week's average production and imports are 106% of goal



Security - Build Justice

- CPA advisors are assisting Iraqi officials with establishing a Commission on Public Integrity (CPI), responsibilities will include:
 - Investigating corruption, enforcing financial disclosure regulations on senior officials, and promulgating a Code of Conduct for public servants
- With last of six judicial training courses due to be completed last week, the program will have reached around 180 judges
 - Covers due process, rule of law, human rights, judicial independence, ethics, developments in international law, and CPA orders
- Weekly programs to train approximately 600 court-appointed defense counselors for defendants continue
- While prisoner transport has improved substantially at most courthouses, the Central Criminal Court of Iraq (CCCI) continues to have transportation difficulties
 - CPA advisors are focusing on correcting transportation issues

Security - Developments

- Ayad Allawi chaired the first meeting of the Ministerial Committee for **National Security since becoming Prime Minister**
 - Previous meetings were chaired by Ambassador Bremer
- Fallujah has remained relatively quiet since the creation of the Fallujah Brigade and there have been no violations of the cease-fire since May 03
- Coalition Forces announced a weapons buy-back program in Karbala
 - A similar program in Sadr City collected more than 4,000 assault rifles and paid out more than \$2 million
- All militias have now agreed to a transition and reintegration plan, which will see almost 90% of the 100,000 militia members to transition into new occupations prior to the elections
- Ministry of Defense moved to a permanent facility, which allows for increased staff and better access to communication and information systems

Security - Developments (Cont)


- Major Iraqi Army base construction is nearing completion at Al Kasik and An Numaniyah
 - Will allow three additional brigades to begin various stages of training
- Iraqi Civil Defense Corp are conducting joint patrols throughout Iraq with other Coalition Forces and Iraqi Police forces
 - On average, 1,300 patrols are conducted each day
 - 35 of the 45 ICDC Battalions are manned above 75 percent
- Iraqi Coastal Defense Force has begun patrolling the Umm Qasr port area
- Iraqi Police Service (IPS) reconstitution continues in areas where police performance has been less than adequate
- Thirty veteran police officers completed the first Mid-Level Management course for the IPS on 29 May
- Approximately 2,000 IPS cadets have graduated from the new police officer training program
 - Fourth class of 271 officers, including 91 women, graduated on 03 Jun


