The number of violent crimes reported to law enforcement agencies throughout the United States decreased 3.2 percent when compared to figures reported the previous year. The violent crime category includes murder, forcible rape, robbery, and aggravated assault. The number of property crimes nationwide decreased 0.1 percent when compared to 2002 data. Property crimes include burglary, larceny-theft, and motor vehicle theft. Data for arson (also a property crime) are not included in the property crime totals. Arson decreased 6.9 percent in 2003 when compared to 2002 figures.

The data presented in Tables 1 and 2 indicate the percent change in offenses known to law enforcement for the calendar years 2002 and 2003 by population group and geographic region, respectively. Table 3 reflects the percent change within the Nation for consecutive years (each year compared to the prior year). Table 4 presents a two-year comparison of offenses known to law enforcement for agencies having a resident population of 100,000 and over for the calendar years 2002 and 2003. All data in this report are preliminary.

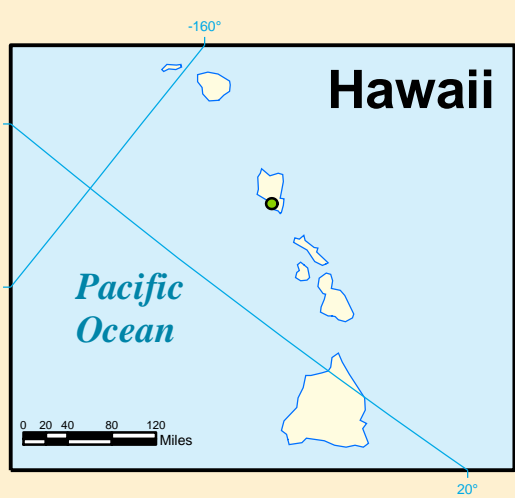
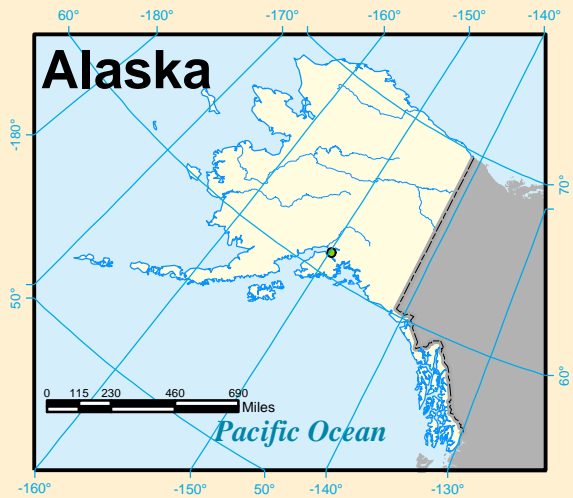
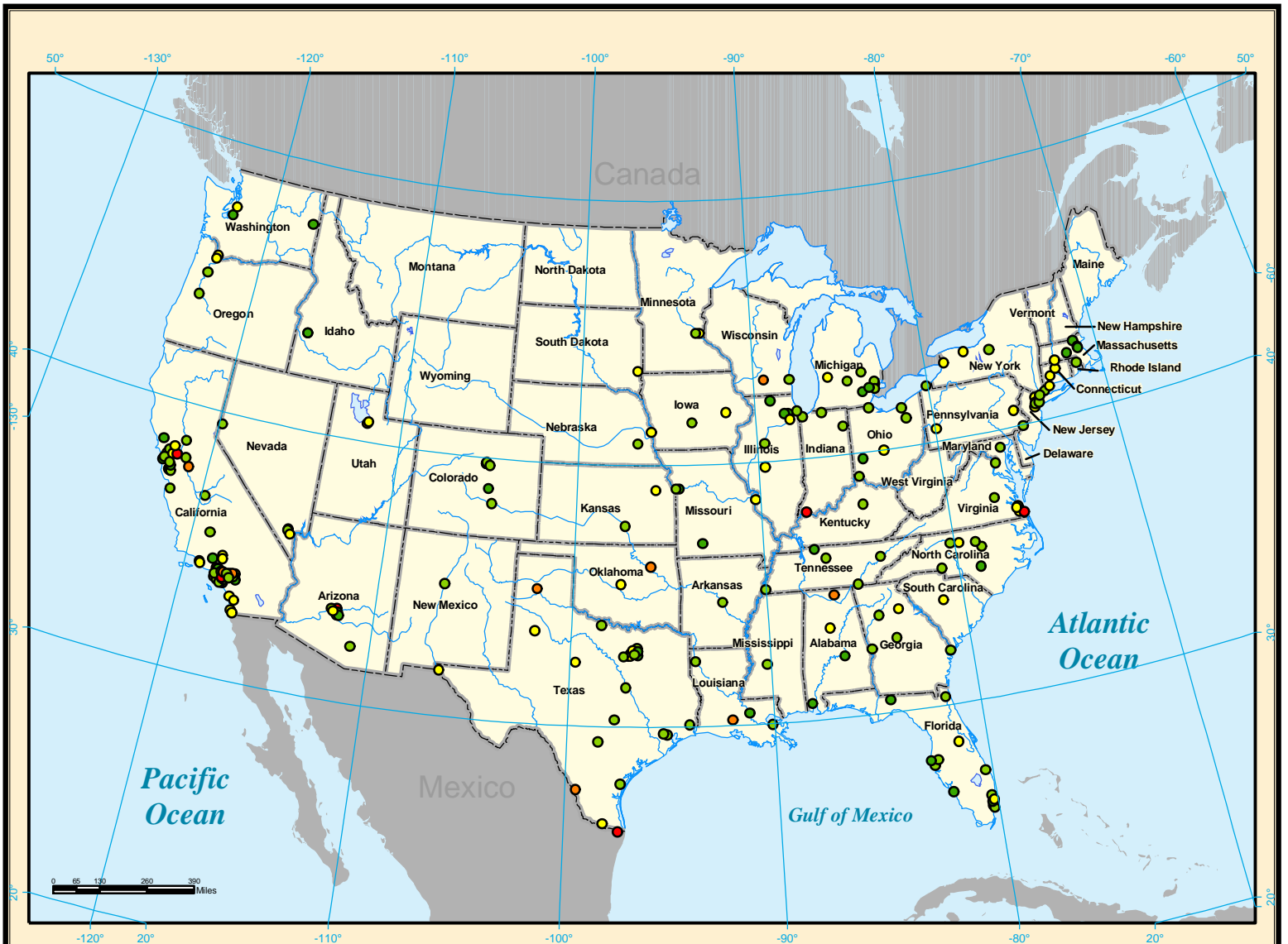
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Percent Change in Reported Violent Crimes

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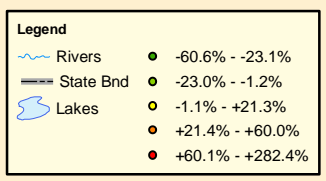
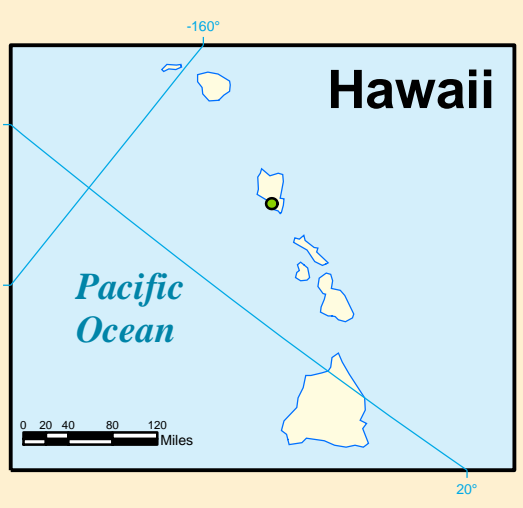
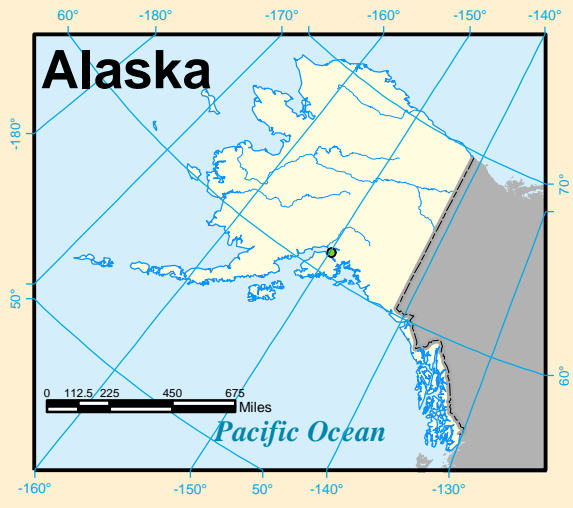
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Percent Change in Reported Murders

January - December, 2002 compared to January - December, 2003

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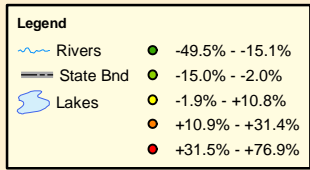
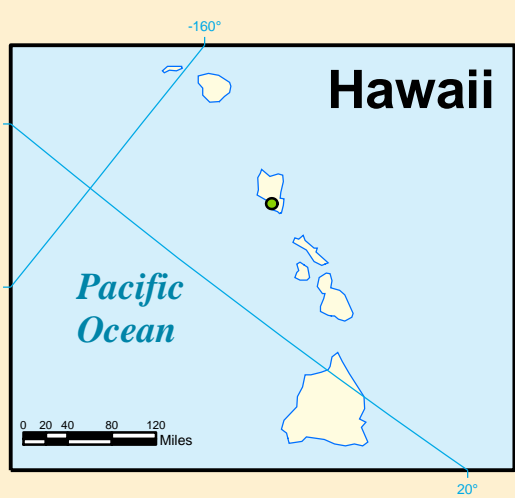
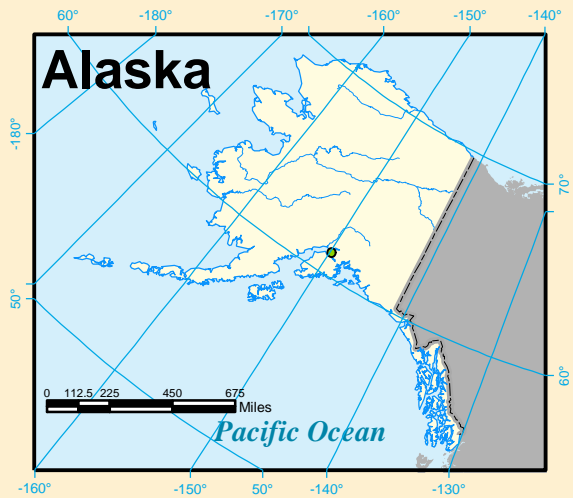
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Percent Change in Reported Forcible Rapes

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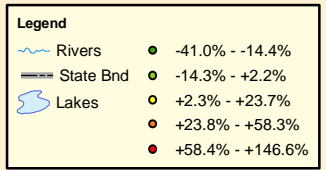
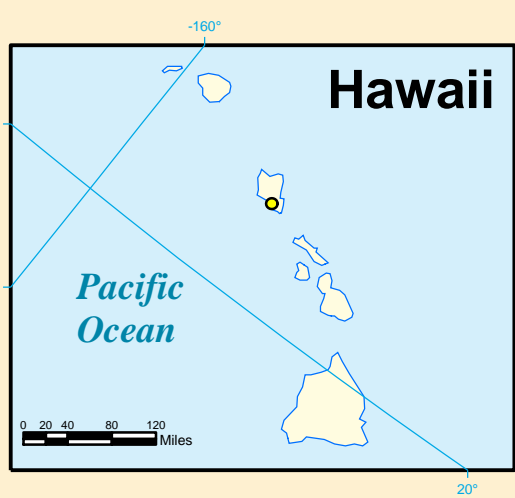
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Percent Change in Reported Robberies

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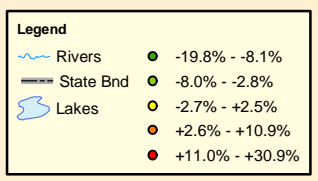
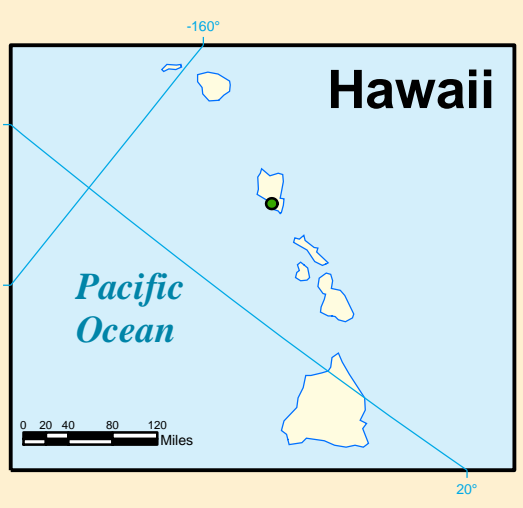
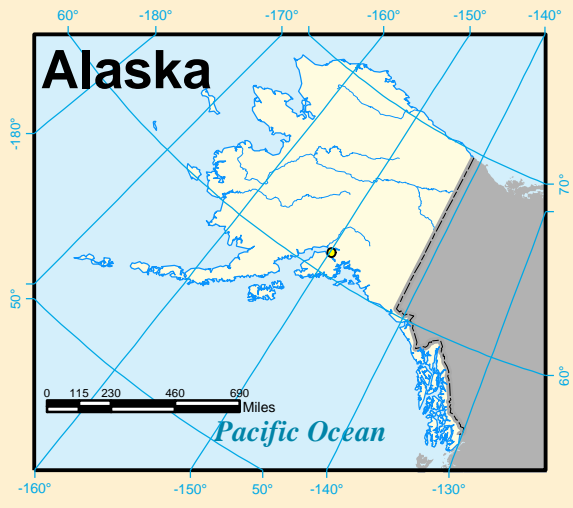
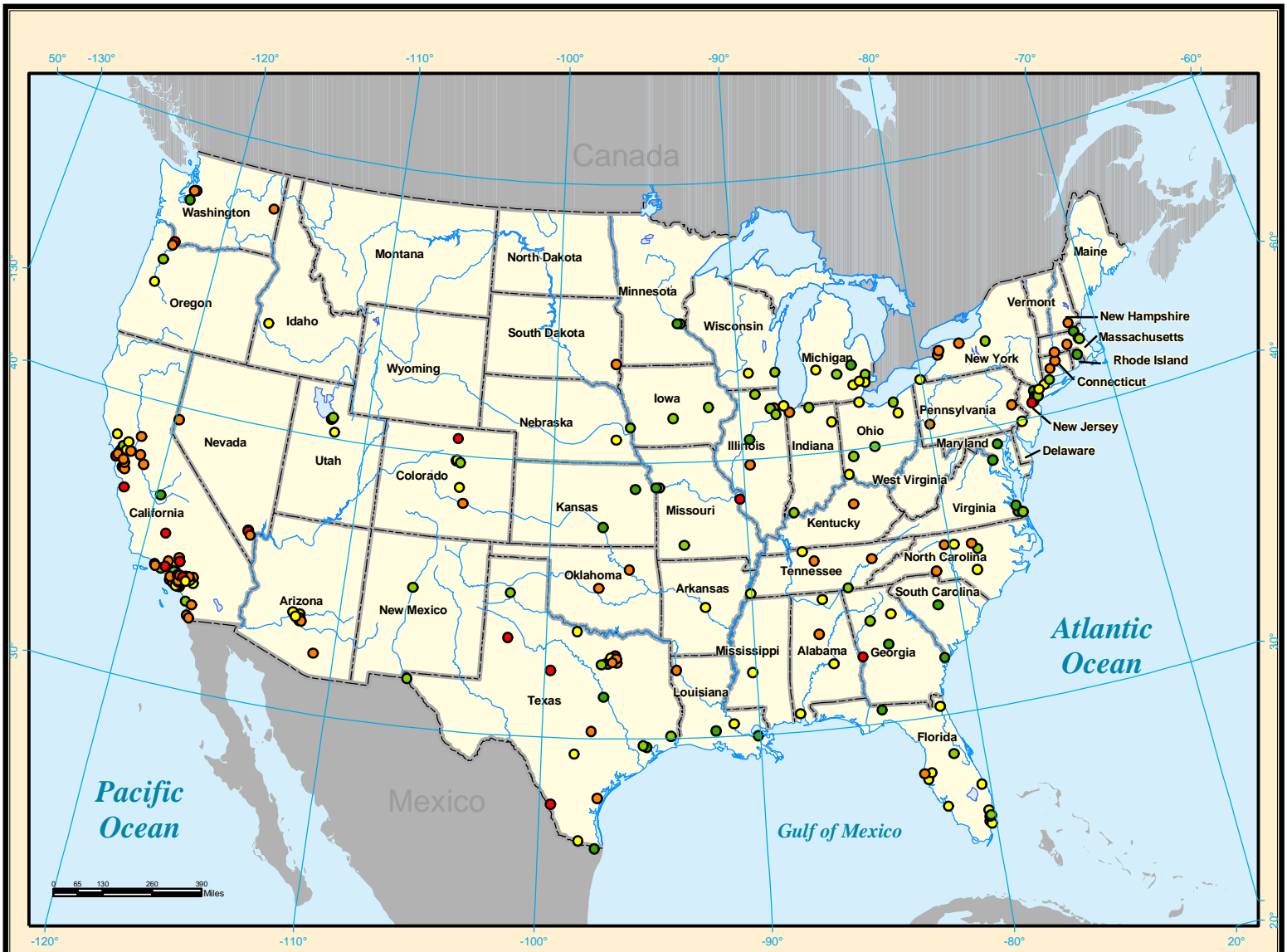
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Percent Change in Reported Aggravated Assaults

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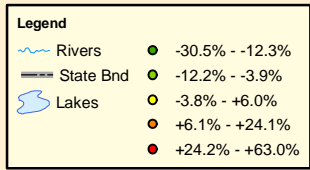
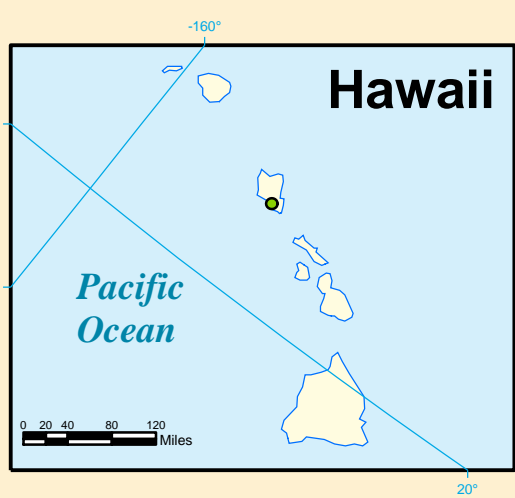
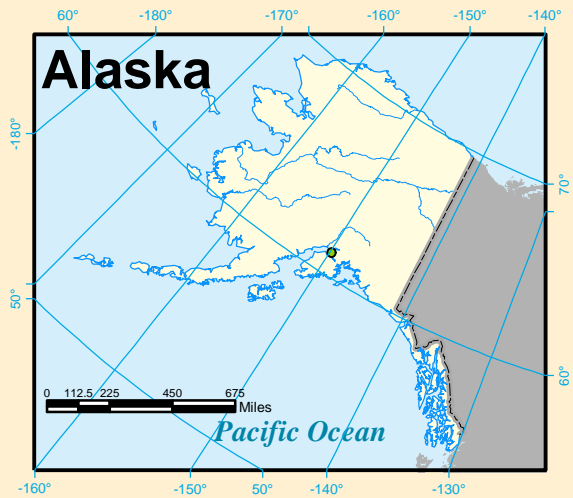
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Percent Change in Reported Property Crimes

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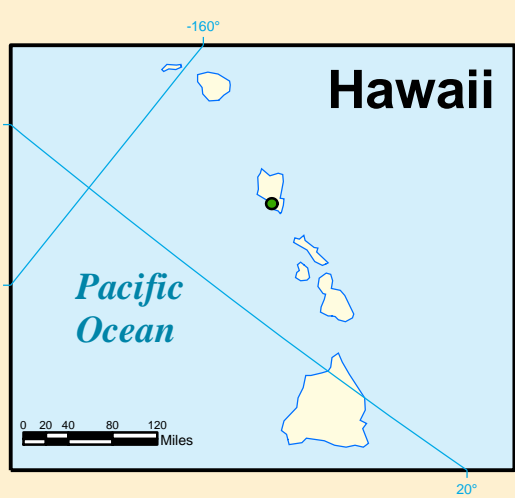
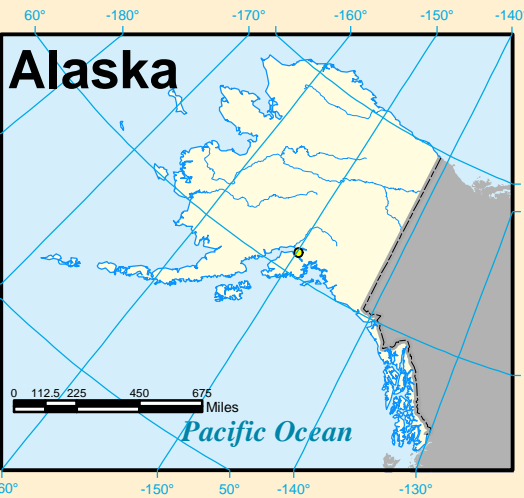
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Percent Change in Reported Burglaries

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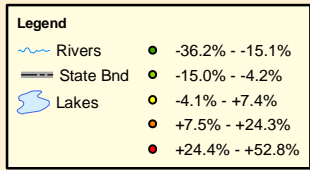
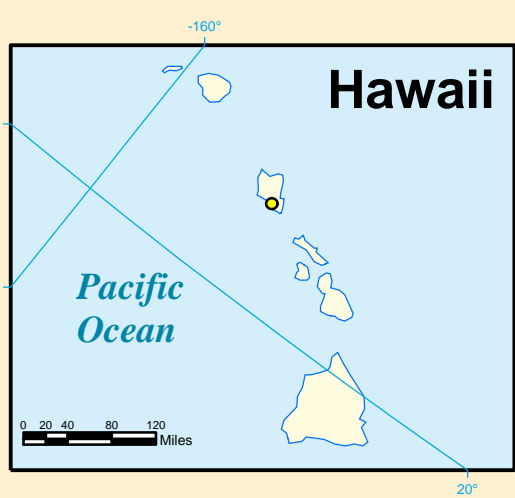
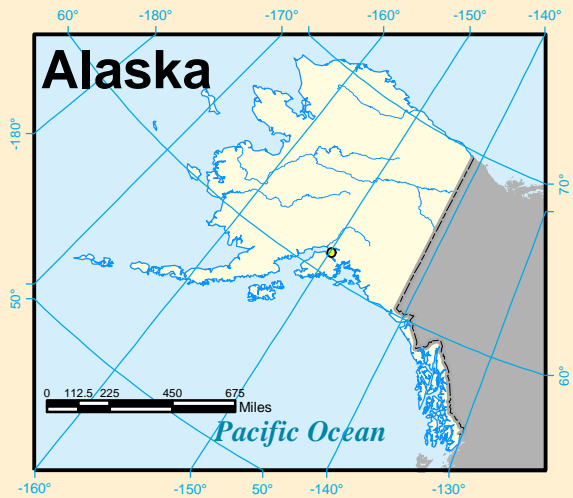
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Percent Change in Reported Larceny-thefts

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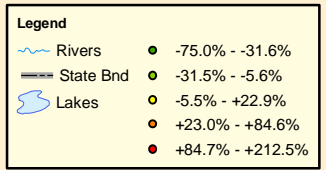
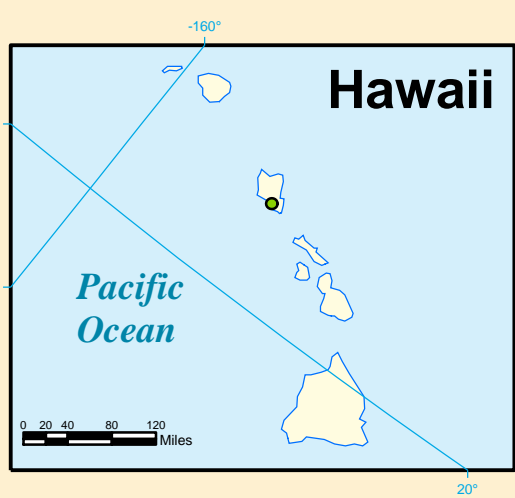
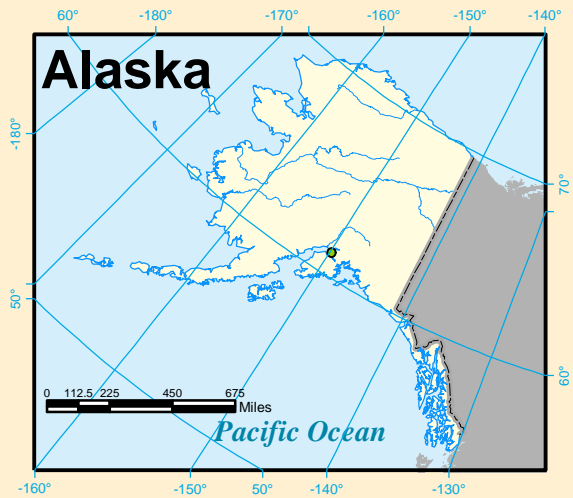
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Percent Change in Reported Motor Vehicle Thefts
