\$100,000 REWARD OFFERED IN THE DEATH OF AUSA JONATHAN P. LUNA

Kevin L. Perkins, Special Agent in Charge of the Baltimore office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) announced today that a reward of up to \$100,000 is being offered for information leading to the resolution of the investigation into the death of Jonathan P. Luna Assistant United States Attorney, Baltimore, Maryland.

On the morning of 12/04/2003, AUSA Jonathan Luna, 38 year-old, black male, failed to appear in court for judicial proceedings in connection with a violent drug trafficking organization. Later the same day, Pennsylvania authorities reported Luna's body had been located in a rural area in Lancaster County, PA.

Since that day, an exhaustive investigation has been conducted by the Baltimore and Philadelphia Divisions of the FBI and the Pennsylvania State Police, in conjunction with the Lancaster County District Attorney's Office, in Lancaster, Pennsylvania, and the United States Attorney's Office in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

Investigation has determined that on December 3, 2003, Jonathan Luna departed the United States Attorney's Office in Baltimore, Maryland, in his 1999, 4-door, silver colored, Honda Accord bearing license plate number UNC 0011. Investigators have been able to establish the following time line:

December 3, 2003

11:38 p.m. Luna's vehicle departs the U.S. District Courthouse, in Baltimore,

Maryland.

11:49 p.m. Luna's vehicle passes through the Ft. McHenry Tunnel Toll Plaza,

northbound on I-95.

December 4, 2004

12:28 a.m. Luna's vehicle continues northbound and passes through the Perryville

Toll Plaza.

12:46 a.m.	Luna's vehicle passes through the Delaware Line Toll Plaza.
12:57 a.m.	Luna's debit card is used at an ATM located at the JFK Plaza, in Newark, Delaware.
2:37 a.m.	(Approximate time) Luna's vehicle accesses the New Jersey Turnpike at Exit 6A, from Route 130.
2:47 a.m.	Luna's vehicle enters the Pennsylvania Turnpike at Exit 359, the Delaware River Bridge.
3:20 a.m.	Luna's debit card is used at the Sunoco gas station, King of Prussia, Pennsylvania to purchase gasoline.
4:04 a.m.	Luna's vehicle exits the Pennsylvania Turnpike at Exit 286 (old exit 21), the Reading/Lancaster interchange.
5:30 a.m.	Luna's body is discovered off of Dry Tavern Road, in Denver, Lancaster County, Pennsylvania.

Investigators have obtained evidence which indicates Luna may have had contact with someone between the time he departed the United States Attorney's Office and the time his body was located at 5:30 a.m. Anyone with information regarding the individual(s) who Luna may have had contact with, any person(s) who may have seen Luna with someone, anyone who knows someone who was with Luna, or any person(s) who saw Luna's vehicle during this time frame should contact the task force hotline at (800) 332-6039 in Lancaster, Pennsylvania, the Baltimore FBI Office at (410) 265-8080, http://baltimore.fbi.gov, the Philadelphia FBI Office at (215) 418-4000, http://philadelphia.fbi.gov.
