## SECTION III

## Crime Index Offenses Cleared

For UCR purposes, law enforcement agencies clear or solve an offense when at least one person is arrested, charged with the commission of the offense, and turned over to the court for prosecution. Clearances recorded in 1997 may be for offenses which occurred in prior years. Several crimes may be cleared by the arrest of one person, or the arrest of many persons may clear only one offense. Law enforcement agencies may clear a crime by exceptional means when some element beyond law enforcement control precludes the placing of formal charges against the offender. Examples of circumstances allowing such clearances are the death of the offender (suicide, justifiably killed by police or private citizen, etc.); the victim's refusal to cooperate with prosecution after the offender has been identified; or the denial of extradition because the offender committed another crime in a different jurisdiction and is being prosecuted there. In all exceptional clearance cases, law enforcement must have identified the offender, have enough evidence to support arrest, and know the offender's location.

In 1997, a 22-percent Crime Index clearance rate (excluding arson) was recorded by law enforcement agencies nationwide. When considering the Modified Crime Index total which includes arson (cleared at a rate of 18 percent), the overall clearance rate remained at 22 percent.

Collectively, 48 percent of violent crimes were cleared. The clearance rates for specific violent offenses were 66 percent for murder, 51 percent for forcible rape, 26 percent for robbery, and 58 percent for aggravated assault. The overall property crime clearance rate (excluding arson) was 18 percent. Among the property crime offenses, 20 percent of larceny-thefts and 14 percent of both motor vehicle thefts and burglaries were cleared during the year. Because crimes against persons (murder, forcible rape, and aggravated assault) are often given more intensive investigative efforts, and the victims and/or witnesses can frequently identify the perpetrators, the clearance rates are generally higher for violent crimes than for property crimes.

Regionally, the highest total Crime Index clearance rate was registered by law enforcement agencies in the Southern States with 23 percent. A 22-percent clearance rate was recorded by law enforcement agencies in the Northeastern states, while law enforcement agencies in the Midwestern and Western States each registered a 20-percent clearance rate for each region. For violent crime, the highest clearance rate, 51 per-
cent, was recorded in the South. In the West, the rate was 49 percent, while the Midwest and Northeast registered rates of 44 and 43 percent, respectively. Property crime clearance rates were 19 percent in the South, 18 percent in the Northeast, 17 percent in the Midwest, and 16 percent in the West.

A review of agencies by community type indicates rural county law enforcement agencies recorded the highest clearance rate for Crime Index offenses, 24 percent. Twenty-two percent of total crimes reported were solved by suburban county agencies and 21 percent by city agencies. Cities with 10,000 to 24,999 inhabitants registered the highest total Crime Index and property crime clearance rates, 26 percent and 23 percent, respectively. Rural counties recorded the highest violent crime clearance rate, 62 percent, and a 61-percent violent crime clearance rate was evidenced in cities with populations under 10,000. (See Table 25.)

## Clearances Involving Only Persons Under 18 Years of Age

Juvenile involvement in crime can be measured by the number of crimes in which they have been identified as the offenders. A clearance by arrest is recorded when an offender under 18 years of age is cited to appear in juvenile court or before other juvenile authorities, even though no physical arrest may have been made. Since the juvenile clearance percentages shown in this publication indicate only those offenses in which no adults were involved, they should be considered a slight underestimation of juvenile involvement in crime. According to 1997 Bureau of the Census estimates, juveniles (persons under 18 years of age) account for 26 percent of the United States population.

Twenty percent of the Crime Index offenses cleared by law enforcement involved only juveniles in 1997. Twelve percent of the violent crime clearances and 23 percent of those for property crimes were accounted for by persons in this age group. Murder showed the lowest percentage of juvenile involvement, 8 percent, while the highest percentage was shown for arson, 46 percent.

Among all regions of the country, the Midwestern States recorded the largest percentage of Crime Index offense involvement by the under 18 age group- 25 percent. In the Western States, juveniles alone were the offenders in 23 percent of the clearances. Juveniles accounted for 19 percent of the clearances in the Northeastern States, and 16 percent of those in the Southern States.
