## SECTION III

Offenses reported to the national UCR Program can be cleared either by arrest or by exceptional means. The administrative closing or "clearing" of a case by a local law enforcement agency does not necessarily mean that an offense can be cleared according to UCR procedures. In order for an offense to be cleared within the Program's guidelines, certain criteria must be met.

## Cleared by Arrest

In the UCR Program, a reporting law enforcement agency clears, or solves, an offense only when all of the following conditions are met. At least one person must be:

- Arrested.
- Charged with the commission of an offense.
- Turned over to the court for prosecution.

The number of offenses and not the number of persons arrested are counted in the clearances. Therefore, the arrest of one person may clear many crimes. Conversely, the arrest of many persons may clear just one offense. In addition, clearances recorded in a particular calendar year such as 2001 may include offenses that occurred in previous years.

## Cleared by Exceptional Means

When elements beyond law enforcement's control prevent the agency from placing formal charges against the offender, the offense is cleared exceptionally for UCR purposes. For an offense to be cleared exceptionally, all of the following criteria must be met. The agency must have:

- Identified the offender.
- Gathered enough evidence to support an arrest, make a charge, and turn over the offender to the court for prosecution.
- Identified the offender's exact location so that law enforcement could make an arrest.
- Encountered a circumstance outside the control of law enforcement that prohibits the agency from arresting, charging, and prosecuting an offender.

Examples of exceptional clearances include but are not limited to the death of the offender (suicide, justifiably killed by police or private citizens, etc.); the victim's refusal to cooperate with the prosecution after the identification of the offender; or the denial of extradition because the offender committed a crime in another jurisdiction and is being prosecuted. Furthermore, the recovery of property does not clear a case for UCR purposes.

## 2001 National Clearances

Law enforcement agencies nationwide recorded a 19.6-percent Crime Index clearance rate. (The Crime Index offenses include murder, forcible rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, motor vehicle theft, and larceny-theft.) The Modified Crime Index total (the Crime Index offenses plus arson) showed a 19.6percent clearance rate for the year and included a 16.0-percent clearance rate for arson.

Violent crimes (murder, forcible rape, robbery, and aggravated assault) often undergo a more vigorous investigative effort than crimes against property. Additionally, victims and/or witnesses often identify the perpetrators. Consequently, violent crimes tend to have higher clearance rates than property crimes. That tendency continued in 2001 with 46.2 percent of violent crimes cleared compared to 16.2 percent of property crimes cleared (excluding arson). Looking at violent crime clearances, the murder clearance rate was 62.4 percent, the aggravated assault clearance rate was 56.1 percent, the forcible rape clearance rate was 44.3 percent, and the robbery clearance rate was 24.9 percent. A review of the clearances for property crimes indicates that the larceny-theft clearance rate was 17.6 percent, the motor vehicle theft clearance rate was 13.6 percent, and the burglary clearance rate was 12.7 percent. (See Table 25.)

## 2001 Regional Clearances

By region, law enforcement agencies in the Northeast recorded the highest Crime Index clearance rate in the Nation- 23.6 percent. The

South had a 19.5-percent clearance rate, the West had a 18.7-percent clearance rate, and the Midwest cleared 18.5 percent of reported offenses. Violent crime clearance rates reported by region were 51.7 percent in the Northeast, 47.2 percent in the West, 45.1 percent in the South, and 41.9 percent in the Midwest. For property crime, the Northeast and South showed clearance rates of 19.8 percent and 16.1 percent, respectively. The Midwest and West recorded clearance rates of 15.9 percent and 14.8 percent, respectively. (See Table 26.)

## 2001 Clearances for Community Types

Among community types, cities collectively cleared 19.4 percent of Crime Index offenses, 44.0 percent of violent crimes, and 16.2 percent of property crimes. Among city groupings, cities with populations of 10,000 to 24,999 showed the highest clearance rate for Crime Index offenses- 23.9 percent. In 2001,
these cities collectively also had the highest property crime clearance rate- 21.2 percent. The highest percentage of violent crimes cleared- 59.7 percent-occurred in cities with less than 10,000 inhabitants. Among the remaining community types, 19.4 percent of Index offenses were cleared in suburban counties, as were 53.6 percent of violent crimes, and 15.2 percent of property crimes. Rural county law enforcement agencies recorded a 23.0-percent clearance rate for Crime Index offenses. Additionally, rural counties had a violent crime clearance rate of 62.0 percent and a property crime clearance rate of 18.1 percent. (See Table 25.)

## Clearances Involving Only Persons Under 18 Years of Age

When an offender under the age of 18 is cited to appear in juvenile court or before other juvenile authorities, the UCR Program records that incident as a clearance by arrest, even though a physical arrest may not have occurred. In addition, according to Program definitions, clearances involving both adult and juvenile offenders are classified as adult clearances. Therefore, because the juvenile clearance percentages in this publication include only the offenses in which there were no adults involved, these figures underestimate juvenile involvement in crime.

Of the Crime Index offenses cleared by law enforcement, 18.6 percent involved only juveniles. In addition, crimes committed by only juveniles accounted for 12.1 percent of violent crime clearances and 21.1 percent of property crime clearances. (See Table 28.)

By region, the Midwest had the largest percentage of clearances for Crime Index offenses involving only juveniles- 23.0 percent. In the West, juveniles alone accounted for 20.9 percent of the clearances; in the Northeast, 17.5 percent; and in the South, 15.6 percent.
