Activate New Facilities.....	1,404	455	\$80,181

An increase of \$80.181 million and 1,404 positions for the activation of 4 facilities (3,806 beds), scheduled to be open in 2001: 3 high security facilities with 2 minimum security camps; and 1 Federal Detention Center (FDC). Activation of the high security prison with camp in Pollock, Louisiana will add 1,088 beds; the high security prison with camp in Atwater, California will add 1,088 beds; the high security facility in Coleman, Florida will add 960 beds. These activations are needed to address the 54% overcrowding rate in high security. Activation of the FDC in Honolulu, Hawaii will add much needed detention bed space (670 beds) in the Western region.

An increase of \$13.081 million and 125 positions for the expansion of 6 facilities (2,444 beds) at Ft. Dix, New Jersey, Elkton, Ohio, Jesup, Georgia, Yazoo City, Mississippi, Seagoville, Texas and Lompoc, California, scheduled to be open in 2001. The BOP received approval for the expansions from Congress in FY 1999. These expansions will convert minimum security beds to modified low security, add work camps to free up low security beds and add housing units inside secure perimeter fences. These expansions will address the 39% overcrowding rate of low security facilities.

These expansions are needed to meet the conditions of the Violent Crime Control and Law Enforcement Act and the Prison Litigation Reform Act which have increased inmate demand for the literacy/GED program.</p>
