This increase will expand the Arrestee Drug Abuse Monitoring System (ADAM) from 35 sites to 50 sites. The ADAM program is the only federally-funded drug use prevalence program which directly addresses the relationship between drug use and criminal behavior; ADAM findings are processed and released immediately and allow for quarterly monitoring in changes of use of a wide range of drugs by numerous subgroups of the offender population, providing local and national policymakers a strong basis from which to make policy decisions. Increasing the number of program sites will expand the ability to directly inquire into drug problems in particular cities, and allow the program to more accurately estimate drug use at the national level. The President's Budget proposes restructuring \$35 million of base funding for state and local domestic prepardeness assistance by eliminating earmarks for counterterrorism laboratories (\$30 million), as these programs are currently under development, we anticipate that there will be a significant amount of carryover into 2001, and an earmark for distance learning resources (\$2 million), as well as a reduction of \$3 million in general law enforcement training, which when combined with the \$33 million requested

increase, will allow \$68 million to be provided for the following enhancements.

\$3 million to expand the First Responder Equipment Acquisition Grant Program, which provides grants to metropolitan jurisdictions, states and territories for the procurement of personal protection, chemical and biological detection, collection, and decontamination equipment for first responders. This equipment is essential to building our Nation's capability to effectively respond to incidents of terrorism involving weapons of mass destruction. Of the \$3 million, \$340,000 is for the Office of Victims of Crime's Rapid Response Unit, and the National Domestic Prepardeness Office (NDPO). This Unit will enable DOJ to provide a timely, and coordinated response to victims of terrorism and mass destruction; 3 position are for the OJP liaison with NDPO to ensure that all counterterrorism activities within OSLDPS are integrated into overall federal programs activities and all training is conducted in accordance with standards, policies, and guidance promulgated by NDPO.

\$2 million for the operations of the Center for Domestic Preparedness at Fort McClellan, AL. The Center for Domestic Preparedness, through its Chemical Defense Training Facility, which is the only "live-agent" training facility in the United States, provides state and local first responders with hands-on training necessary to effectively plan for and respond to incidents of domestic terrorism involving chemical or biological agents and nuclear and explosive devices. This enhancement will enable the Center to install a security system and provide for a student tracking system for management.

\$9 million to expand the Law Enforcement First Responder Training Program, in particular, the Law Enforcement Awarness Course, the development of a Tactical Operations Training Curricula for state and local SWAT and Tactical teams in cooperation with the Hazardous Materials Response Unit of the FBI, the expansion of a training program for 3,300 sheriffs nationwide, and the development of a new course for senior command staff in sheriff and police departments.

\$6 million to provide a technical assistance program, designed to provide reactive, individualized technical assistance to state and local jurisdictions participating in OJP's domestic preparedness programs. Technical assistance will address specific jurisdictional problems or concerns with the implementation of OJP's domestic preparedness programs.

\$31 million for costs associated with the Nunn-Lugar-Domenici (NLD) Domestic Preparedness Training Program (NLD). This Department of Defense (DoD) program, which was created in response to the 1996 Defense Authorization Bill, is proposed to be formally transferred to the Office of Justice Programs on October 1, 2000. The NLD Domestic Preparedness Training Program targets the 120 most populous cities, providing them with classroom training, various
