April 24th Lek Courtship Ritual Medora Ranger District

Join wildlife biologists for this early morning observation of the sharp-tailed grouse mating dance. During courtship, males inflate air sacs at the sides of the neck, emitting booming calls while strutting with tails fanned and wings expanded. **Meet at Tesoro (Superpumper) in Belfield, ND**. From I-94 exit #42, go south; Tesoro is on the left. The event leader will meet you at the north side of the parking lot. We encourage people to carpool—cars can be left along the north fence, please don't park next to the building. Little walking is involved.

May 8th Head for the River! *How to Canoe the Little Missouri*

This morning talk will help prepare you for tackling the Little Missouri Scenic River by canoe. You'll enjoy the rugged beauty of northern Little Missouri National Grasslands. We'll examine floodplain terraces that harbor a variety of trees and shrubby vegetation. At the riverbank we'll experience the cool shade of the river that formed one of the largest areas of Badlands on the continent. From our vantage point, we'll see how the river has cut down through sedimentary layers to form sheer, colorful cliffs. Meet at Chimney Park in Medora, ND. Take I-94 to Medora. Chimney Park is just west of town, next the Theodore Roosevelt National Park entrance station. Meet the hike leader near the large chimney. We encourage people to car-pool—vehicles can be left at the park. Bring your water, lunch and/or snacks.
