| EMPLOYEES | Each licensee must have a sufficient number of trained employees <br> to provide the husbandry or care required for the animals. [3.12, <br> $3.32,3.57,3.85,3.108,3.132]$ |
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| Criteria | Factors for evaluating the appropriateness of the number of <br> employees include, but are not limited to: <br> - <br> number of animals <br> maintenance requirements of the animals <br> construction and design of facility |
| -Example: All wood facilities require more maintenance. <br> routine condition of the facility <br> Example: If always in compliance, there may be enough <br> employees. If always out of compliance in areas related to <br> husbandry/care, there may not be enough employees <br> an employee's area of responsibility <br> Example: An employee is responsible for the care of both <br> regulated and non-regulated animals and the care of the non- <br> regulated animals takes most of his/her time, resulting in the <br> care of the regulated animals being adversely affected. |  |
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Factors in determining an adequately trained employee include, but are not limited to:

- background and experience
- demonstration of proper handling of the animal
- facility-provided training
- formal training, i.e., apprenticeships/certification
- training by the attending veterinarian

Indicators of inadequately trained employees include, but are not limited to:

- high incidence of injury to:
- personnel
- animals
- inadequate cleanliness of facility

Employees must be supervised by an individual who has a
background in animal husbandry or care.
