RANDOM SOURCE DOG AND CAT DEALER INSPECTION

Only a class "B" dealer may acquire random source dogs & cats for resale. [2.132]

Definition

Random source means dogs and cats obtained from animal pounds or shelters, auction sales, or from any person who did not breed and raise them on his/her premises.

Procurement

Acceptable Sources

A class "B" dealer may obtain live random source dogs/cats **only** from the following sources:

- other USDA licensed dealers [2.132(a)(1)]
- State, county, or city owned and operated animal pounds or shelters [2.132(a)(2)]
- humane groups and contract pounds organized as legal entities under the laws of their State [2.132(a)(3)]

A class "B" dealer may obtain non-random source dogs/cats from persons who have bred and raised the dog/cat on their own premises.

Unacceptable Sources

A class "B" dealer may **not** obtain dogs/cats:

- from a person who did not breed and raise the animal on his/her premises [2.132(b)]
- by use of false pretenses, misrepresentation, or deception [2.132(d)]

Holding Period

Pounds, Shelters, and Research Facilities

Random source dogs/cats must be held for a period of not less than 5 full days, including a Saturday, but not including the day of acquisition and transit time, by the following entities: [2.101]

- pound/shelter owned and operated by a State, county or city
- privately owned pound/shelter, such as a humane society, that is under contract with a State, county or city
- research facility licensed as a dealer

ANIMAL CARE 8.10.1

Live dogs and cats must be held by the dealer for the following time periods: [2.101]

another USDA licensed dealer or exhibitor who has already held the dog/cat for the required holding period	any age	24 hours, not including the time in transit [2.101(a)(2)]
another USDA licensed dealer or exhibitor who has not held the dog/cat for the required holding period	any age	5 full days, not including the day of acquisition and the time in transit [2.101(a)]

8.10.2 ANIMAL CARE

Records

Records of all dogs and cats must contain the following information: [2.75]

- name and complete address of the seller, buyer or person to whom the animal is given [2.75(a)(1)(i)]
- USDA license or registration number if seller/buyer/donee is USDA licensed or registered [2.75(a)(1)(ii)]
- vehicle license number and driver's license number and state of issuance of each if seller/buyer/donee is not USDA licensed or registered [2.75(a)(1)(iii)]
- date animal was acquired [2.75(a)(1)(v)]
- date animal was disposed of, including euthanasia [2.75(a)(1)(v)]
- official USDA tag or tattoo number [2.75(a)(1)(vi)]
- a description of each animal including: [2.75(a)(1)(vii)]
 - the species and breed or type
 - the sex
 - date of birth or approximate age
 - the color and any distinctive markings

Records must be made, kept and maintained on APHIS Form 7005-Record of Acquisition and Dogs and Cats on Hand and APHIS Form 7006 - Record of Disposition of Dogs and Cats. [2.75(2)]

Exception:

A dealer who uses a computerized record keeping system may request a variance from the requirement to use APHIS Forms 7005 and 7006. [2.75(a)(2)(i)]

The variance request must: [2.75(a)(2)(i)]

- be in writing
- explain why the APHIS Form 7005/7006 is unsuitable to use
- contain a description and sample of the computerized record keeping system to be used
- be sent to the appropriate Animal Care Regional Office

If the variance is denied, the dealer may request a hearing for the purpose of showing why the variance should not be denied.

The denial of the variance remains in effect until the final legal decision is rendered.

8.10.3 ANIMAL CARE

Records Holding Period

Records must be held for inspection for 1 year after an animal is disposed of or euthanized.[2.80(a)]

Records must be kept and maintained for more than 1 year if: [2.80(b)]

- necessary to comply with any applicable Federal, State, or local law
- APHIS Administrator notifies the dealer in writing that specified records must be retained pending completion of an investigation

Special Circumstance

A dealer who operates a private or contract pound or shelter must comply with the following:

Facility:

- pound/shelter must be physically separated from the licensed facility [2.132(e)(1)] AND
- pound/shelter animal housing facility must not be adjacent to the licensed facility, i.e., no common walls [2.132(e)(1)]

Records:

- accurate and complete records must be separately maintained in accordance with Sections 2.75 and 2.76, unless the animals are lost or stray [2.132(e)(2)]
- for lost or stray animals, the pound/shelter records must provide the following information:
 - an accurate description of the animal [2.132(e)(2)(i)]
 - how, where, when, and from whom the animal was obtained [2.132(e)(2)(ii)]

Transferring the dog/cat to the "B" dealership:

- Animal must be held for 10 full days, not including day of acquisition and time in transit [2.101(a)(1)]
- Record of animal must contain all of the information listed above AND
 - how long the animal had been at the pound/shelter before transfer to the dealer's licensed facility [2.132(e)(2)(iii)]
 - the date the animal was transferred to the dealer's licensed facility [2.132(e)(2)(iv)]

8.10.4 ANIMAL CARE

CERTIFICATION

A dealer must provide the recipient of a random source dog and/or cat certification that contains all the information required by the regulations. [2.133]

Certification for a random source dog/cat must contain the following information: [2.133(b)]

- name, complete address, USDA license number and signature of the dealer [2.133(b)(1)]
- name, complete address, USDA license or registration number, if applicable, and signature of the recipient [2.133(b)(2)]
- a description of each animal which includes: [2.133(b)(3)]
 - species and breed or type (for mixed breeds, estimate the two dominant breeds/types) [2.133(b)(3)(i)]
 - the sex [2.133(b)(3)(ii)]
 - ► date of birth or approximate age [2.133(b)(3)(iii)]
 - ► color and any distinctive markings [2.133(b)(3)(iv)]
 - official USDA-approved identification number

NOTE: If the description information is provided by a prior dealer and attached to the certification, then only the official ID number is required. [2.133(b)(3)(v)]

- name and complete address of the person, pound or shelter from which the animal was acquired [2.133(b)(4)]
- an assurance that the person, pound or shelter was notified that the animal might be used for research or educational purposes [2.133(b)(4)]
- date dealer acquired the dog/cat [2.133(b)(5)]
- if dog/cat acquired from a pound/shelter or research facility, a signed statement that the pound or shelter held the animal for the required 5 days [2.133(b)(6)]

NOTE: This statement:

- must describe the animal by its USDA ID number
- may be incorporated into the dealer certification at the time of acquisition OR
- made separately and attached to the certification later. If made separately, it must include a description of the animal as required in the certification. A photocopy is regarded as a duplicate original.

ANIMAL CARE 8.10.5

The original certification must accompany the shipment of any random source dog/cat. [2.133(c)]

A dealer who obtains a random source dog/cat from another dealer must obtain and attach the original certification to the certification which he/she provides to the recipient of the animal. [2.133(d)]

A dealer must keep, maintain and make available for APHIS inspection a copy of the certification for at least one year following disposition of the animal. [2.133(e)]
