

"Preparing Yarn for Weaving" by Gerald Nailor, 1940. Medium - oil on plaster. Location - eighth floor, South Penthouse, Main Interior Building. This mural shows a Navajo woman sitting in front of a nearly finished blanket on a traditional loom frame. The artist, who was born in 1917 in Pindedale, New Mexico, and died in 1952, was a member of the Navajo Indian Tribe. His Indian name, Toh-Yah, means "Walking by the River."
