COMPLAINT

TO: THE HONORABLE ELIZABETH D. LAPORTE,
UNITED STATES MAGISTRATE JUDGE:

I, William I. Shockley, being duly sworn, depose and state that I am an Assistant United States Attorney for the Northern District of California and act for and on behalf of the Government of France (the Requesting State) pursuant to Treaty entered into force on February 1, 2002, (the Treaty) with respect to Barrie Taylor (the fugitive).

In accordance with Title 18, United States Code, Section 3184, I charge, on information and belief, as follows:

1. Foreign charge(s). The fugitive is duly and legally charged with having committed, in the jurisdiction of the Requesting State, the crime of: murder pursuant to articles 295, and 394 of the penal code of France, and since March 1, 1994, pursuant to articles 221-1, 221-6, 221-9, 221-11 and 639 of the penal code of France.

COMPLAINT FOR EXTRADITION

1 Article 2 of the Treaty provides that a charge for such offense(s) shall serve as the basis for
2 extradition.

3 2. Foreign arrest warrant. A warrant for the fugitive's arrest was issued on July 1, 1998,
4 by the Versailles Court of Criminal Appeal.

5 3. Facts underlying foreign charge(s). According to an investigation by authorities of the
6 Requesting State, on September 28, 1993, Versailles police went to the residence of Barrie
7 Taylor and Philippe Pavageau and questioned Barrie Taylor concerning the whereabouts of the
8 victim, Roxane Pavageau, wife of Philippe. At that time, Taylor denied knowledge of the
9 whereabouts of Roxane Paveneau. Returning on September 30, police inspected the
10 Paveneau/Taylor residence. In the back yard they discovered a recently-dug hole with
11 dimensions of approximately 2m x 0,50m x 0.30m. Police noted earth on Barrie Taylor's hands.
12 Police discovered the body of Roxane Paveneau, bound hand and foot, on the stairway leading
13 from the cellar to the back yard. The guardrail of the stairway had been covered by a quilt which
14 screened the stairway from view from the neighbor's house. The knees were bound by electrical
15 wire, and the head and trunk were obscured by a dustbin bag affixed at chest level by electric
16 wire. Police located marks which appeared to be blood stains in the entrance, sitting and dining
17 room, and a pair of gloves with marks of a brownish color.

18 At times Barrie Taylor retreated behind a purported language barrier between English and
19 French, even though police had been advised by Philippe Pavageau that Barrie Taylor could speak
20 and read French without any problem. When police asked difficult questions, Taylor began to
21 cry, put her fingers in her ears or asserted she could not remember what had happened. Taylor
22 did tell police that Roxane Paveneau had arrived at her house on September 28 with the intent of
23 killing her husband. Taylor told police that Roxane Paveneau had stuck her with an unknown
24 object which Taylor then used to strike Roxane Paveneau. Taylor then left the house for several
25 hours and returned to find Roxane Paveneau dead. Taylor said she dug a hole in the garden
26 without being able to specify why. Taylor stated she did not remember moving the body and had
27 no idea who had covered and bound the body. Taylor claimed she dialed 911 the day of the
28 incident, but France Telecom records reflect no such call was made.

1 Forensic medical examination of the body determined it to be that of Roxane Paveneau.
2 The examination revealed approximately twenty wounds on the right side of the victim's skull,
3 with multiple skull fractures and brain lesions. The dome of the skull was crushed. The
4 examination revealed that the wounds were the cause of death.

5 4. Fugitive's presence in the U.S. The fugitive, who is within the jurisdiction of this
6 Court, may be found at 815 third Street, Santa Cruz, CA 95060-5001, or at South Coast Medical
7 Center, 31872 Coast highway, Laguna Beach, CA 92651.

8 5. Fugitive's description. The fugitive, a citizen of the United States, born on March 5,
9 1955, is described as follows: slender adult female 1.65 m tall, with brown eyes and light brown
10 hair. French authorities arrested Barrie Taylor after the commission of this offense, and obtained
11 her photograph and fingerprints, copies of which have been transmitted to the U.S. Marshal for
12 the Northern District of California. Barrie Taylor fled France to the United States while awaiting
13 trial in France for the murder of Roxane Paveneau.

14 6. Risk of flight. The likelihood of flight is substantial if the fugitive learns of the request
15 prior to arrest.

16 Whereupon, your complainant requests:

- 17 a. that a warrant be issued pursuant to Title 18, United States Code, Section 3184, for the
18 fugitive's arrest;
- 19 b. that the fugitive be brought before this Court and the evidence of criminality be heard;
- 20 c. that if, on such hearing, the Court deems the evidence sufficient under the provisions of
21 the Treaty to sustain the charge(s), the Court certify the same to the Secretary of State in order
22 that a warrant may be issued for the surrender of the fugitive to the appropriate authorities of the
23 Requesting State according to the Treaty; and
- 24 d. that this Court take such other actions as may be required under the provisions of the
25 Treaty and the laws of the United States to meet the obligations of the United States under the

1 Treaty, including the seizure of any items or materials in the fugitive's possession at the time of
2 apprehension which are related to the crimes charged or which may be used as evidence,
3 pursuant to Article 18 of the Treaty.
