The melting point given above is that of selected samples from lot 42e. The agreement among the samples tested indicates that the lot is homogeneous within a few thousandths of a degree in melting point. The above value is not necessarily the same as the melting point of pure tin.

Full details of the precautions that should be observed in freezing-point determinations are given in National Bureau of Standards Journal of Research 14, 247, 1935 (RP768). The International Temperature Scale of 1948 is described in the Journal of Research of the National Bureau of Standards, 42, 209, 1949 (RP1962).
