





Matching Grant Program

The Matching Grant Program allows U.S. private voluntary organizations (PVOs) working overseas to expand successful projects to new locations and initiate new projects. The program also enables U.S. PVOs to undertake experimental and innovative projects that offer the potential for learning and replication.

For 26 years, the Matching Grant Program has helped U.S. PVOs develop their community-based programs overseas. Managed by the Office of Private Voluntary Cooperation-American Schools and Hospitals Abroad, the program matches dollar-for-dollar a PVO's own resources. Grants support programs consistent with the U.S. Agency for International Development's (USAID's) evolving program priorities (e.g., microenterprise development, strategic partnerships) and geographical interests (e.g., Central Asia, Africa). The program awarded its last grant in Fiscal Year 2002; ongoing activities are due to be phased out by Fiscal Year 2007.


Matching grants to PVOs support clearly defined, field-oriented programs. The programs are fully conceived and incorporate rigorous evaluation criteria. They can be as broad as the overall scope of a PVO's work or as specific as community-based health services or microenterprise development, but must stay within USAID's legislative mandate and development priorities.

Until Fiscal Year 2002, PVOs were awarded these grants based on a demonstrated ability to implement successful, sustainable development programs. Ongoing activities strive to meet the program's four major objectives —


- to expand and strengthen the field programs of U.S. PVOs in program areas to increase sustainability and results that are consistent with USAID policies and priorities;
- to assist U.S. PVOs to further enhance their planning systems, management systems, and technical competencies so they can carry out development programs;
- to build the capacity of local nongovernmental organizations, governmental organizations, and community-based organizations through formalized partnerships with U.S. PVOs; and
- to increase U.S. private resources for development assistance through a combined public/private partnership by matching private contributions on a dollar-for-dollar basis.

Note: On July 1, 2002, the Matching Grant Program was subsumed under the Program Development and Management Division (PDM) within the Office of Private Voluntary Cooperation – American Schools and Hospitals Abroad (PVC-ASHA), Bureau for Democracy, Conflict and Humanitarian Assistance (DCHA).

NGO Sector Strengthening Program

The NGO Sector Strengthening Program aims to help local indigenous nongovernmental organizations (NGOs), networks, and intermediate service organizations (ISOs) become more effective in the delivery of development services.

The NGO Sector Strengthening Program is a follow-on to the U.S. Agency for International Development's (USAID's) Matching Grant Program, which helped strengthen U.S. private voluntary organizations (PVOs) and their in-country partners. USAID's experience in building capacity of individual PVOs and networks over the past 10 years provides insights into effective interventions and approaches. However, unlike programs that focus on strengthening single NGOs, this program seeks to address the NGO sector more broadly by improving the service delivery organizations that have constituencies at the local level and the networks and ISOs that strengthen and link them to a broad array of partners.


Anticipated results from this program will contribute to —

- enactment of key policies and program recommendations that lead to scale and replication; and
- increased ability to mitigate or recover from civil conflict.



Cooperative Development Program

Self-reliant cooperative enterprises meet the evolving needs of their members and contribute to the quality of their lives and to their communities and nations. As member-owned and controlled institutions, cooperatives foster democratic values and practices.

The Foreign Assistance Act of 1961, as amended, encourages the transfer of American cooperative experience and expertise to help the people of developing and transitional economies to create and strengthen cooperative institutions. The U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID) dedicates support and financial assistance to U.S. cooperative development organizations (CDOs). The Office of Private Voluntary Cooperation – American Schools and Hospitals Abroad (PVC-ASHA) manages a competitive grant program, which supports development of innovative approaches to the major challenges faced in cooperative development, their dissemination, and their integration into ongoing programs and projects.

Cooperative Development Program objectives include delivering the quality of support required by CDOs to attract the human, institutional, and financial resources necessary to enhance their impact on —


- the reform of cooperative law and regulation and the promotion of a positive environment that enables cooperation;
- effective governance that ensures that democratic control is a reality and not merely rhetoric;
- the self-sustaining cooperative movement and expansion within sectors that are consistent with high quality performance;
- bilateral, multilateral, and foundation support for cooperative development that is matched by member funds; and
- U.S. cooperative investments in alliances and joint ventures with developing and transitional economy cooperatives.

CDOs work in agricultural credit, supply, and marketing; agribusiness; savings and credit; rural telephone and electric services; insurance; health; and housing. CDOs help demonstrate the ways in which cooperation can enable and empower those with limited assets to participate in emerging market economies.

CDOs that have a long-term association with USAID may mentor other eligible U.S. cooperatives that are interested in implementing cooperative development activities overseas.



Ocean Freight Reimbursement Program

The Ocean Freight Reimbursement (OFR) Program provides subsidies to private voluntary organizations (PVOs) to ship humanitarian supplies and equipment overseas in support of privately funded development and humanitarian assistance programs.


The OFR Program is the oldest ongoing PVO support program. The Foreign Assistance Act of 1961, Section 123 (b), authorized the creation of the program and, as amended, allows the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID) to subsidize registered U.S. PVOs for their ocean freight transportation costs. The program is unique because it allows small and newly registered PVOs to participate in the highly competitive, yet less complex Office of Private Voluntary Cooperation – American Schools and Hospitals Abroad (PVC-ASHA) grant processes.

Small competitive grants are provided by the program to U.S. PVOs each year. Funds are used to reimburse the PVOs for the cost of transporting donated commodities (such as medical supplies, agricultural equipment, educational supplies, and building equipment) to developing countries.


The OFR Program helps USAID expand its pool of developing partners by reaching out to small and newly registered PVOs and by providing grants to many first-time applicants; in Fiscal Year 2003, the Agency funded 47 PVOs. Although USAID reimburses the costs of ocean freight, participating PVOs are responsible for ancillary costs, such as commodity acquisition, warehousing, insurance, local transportation, and distribution. The program leverages resources many times the size of USAID funding.

The Capable Partners Program (CAP) supports innovative approaches to strengthening local organizations that are playing an increasingly important role in meeting the social and economic needs of their societies.

The Office of Private Voluntary Cooperation – American Schools and Hospitals Abroad (PVC-ASHA) uses CAP to provide technical assistance directly through a core program and through Missions requests to enhance the performance of community-based nongovernmental organizations (NGOs) and the networks and intermediate service organizations (ISOs) that provide support services to NGOs. CAP will also promote organizational development, including advocacy skills, monitoring and evaluation capability, and greater links between these local organizations and businesses, local governments, and international bodies.


The CAP Program aims to —

A vibrant NGO sector is more than a series of discrete organizations acting in isolation, and CAP is a strategic approach to facilitate the strengthening of local NGO sectors.



American Schools and Hospitals Abroad (ASHA) has provided grants to competitively selected private, non-profit universities and secondary schools, libraries, and medical centers abroad for nearly 50 years. Since its inception, the program has assisted some 200 institutions in more than 60 countries around the world. Its current portfolio includes more than 100 grants, with approximately 25 new grants awarded each year.


ASHA grants are generally used to support capital improvements, such as the construction of academic buildings and medical facilities, and the procurement of medical and educational equipment.

Objectives of the ASHA grant program include —

- Building a technology base for integrated research and care in critical areas of medical science;
- Creating a more efficient basis for communication and transfer of information between the United States and other countries;
- Training independent thinkers with problem-solving abilities; and
- Increasing understanding between the people of the United States and those abroad.


